

Operator Characteristics

The average age of farmers continues to rise with the majority of farm operators between 45 and 64, and they increasingly rely on off-farm employment which increased from 45.9 percent in 2002 to 48.7 percent in 2007. The percentage of farms operated by family or individual was 86.5 percent in 2007, down from 89.7 percent in 2002.



Minority Operators

In the past 5 years, U.S. farm operators have become more demographically diverse. The percentage of farms with female

principle operator increased from 11.2 percent in 2002 to 13.9 percent in 2007. The number of farms with American Indian or Alaska Native operators, black or African American operators, Hispanic operators, and Asian operators increased from 2002 to 2007 as well.
