In 2018, the U.S. Virgin Islands had 565 farms, up 158% from 219 farms in 2007. These farms accounted for 9,324 acres of farmland. This was an increase of 3,443 acres (59%) from the 2007 level.

During the same time, the average farm size decreased 39%, from 26.9 acres in 2007 to 16.5 acres in 2018.

Farm counts increased significantly across most farm size groups. Farms with less than 3 acres experienced the largest change, increasing by 182 farms (212%).
