Week Ending September 27, 2015

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Arkansas, there were 6.9 days suitable for fieldwork for the **week ending Sunday, September 27, 2015**. Topsoil moisture supplies were 18 percent very short, 54 percent short, 25 percent adequate, and 3 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 17 percent very short, 52 percent short, 28 percent adequate, and 3 percent surplus. Low temperatures ranged from 51.4 degrees Fahrenheit at Calico Rock to 64.3 degrees Fahrenheit at Hot Springs. Highs ranged from 77.1 degrees Fahrenheit at Winslow and Kingston to 89.1 degrees Fahrenheit at Nashville. The precipitation for this week was spread throughout the state, with the highest concentration in the West Central region of the state with an average of 0.31 inches.

"There were some reports of Perilla mint poisoning in cows. Working cattle and preparing ground for planting cool season forages. Watching fall calving cows for any assistance which might be needed. Bush-hogging unsprayed pastures."
