Week Ending: March 12, 2023

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Arkansas, there were 1.7 days suitable for fieldwork for the **week ending Sunday, March 12, 2023**. Topsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 2 percent short, 37 percent adequate, and 61 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 3 percent very short, 3 percent short, 56 percent adequate, and 38 percent surplus.

## Arkansas Subsoil Moisture Map for the week of February 27 - March 5, 2023

The Soil Moisture Active Passive (SMAP) provides measurements of soil moisture in the root zone as a weekly average, represented by pixels. Each pixel represents 9 by 9 kilometer plot or about 20,000 acres. The SMAP data measures soil moisture in cubic centimeters of water/cubic centimeters of soil. The scale represents the percent of water in a given volume of soil.
