**Corn Acreage Down 12 Percent Cotton Acreage Up 8 Percent** Rice Acreage Down 2 Percent Soybean Acreage Up 7 Percent

Arkansas **corn** producers intend to plant 750,000 acres, down 12 percent from the 850,000 acres planted in 2021.

**Upland cotton** acreage intentions are at 520,000 acres, up 8 percent from the 480,000 acres planted last year.

All hay acres expected to be harvested in Arkansas are estimated at 1.19 million acres, up 7,000 acres from 2021.

Oats producers intend to plant 10,000 acres in 2022, unchanged from last year.

Arkansas **peanut** producers intend to plant 35,000 acres in 2022, down 3 percent from last year.

All rice intended planted acres for 2022 are estimated at 1.19 million acres, down 2 percent from the 1.21 million acres planted in 2021. Long grain rice acres are down 15,000 acres from last year, and medium grain acres are down 5,000 acres from a year ago.

Soybean producers intend to plant 3.25 million acres in 2022, up 7 percent from last year.

Winter wheat acreage in Arkansas is up 5 percent from last year to an estimated 220,000 acres planted for all purposes in 2022.






# Corn: Area Planted - Arkansas and United States: 2002 - 2022




All Hay: Area Harvested - Arkansas and United States: 2002 - 2022




Soybeans: Area Planted - Arkansas and United States: 2002 - 2022
