MINK AND HONEY

<u>MINK</u>: Mink production in Illinois is located primarily in the northeastern corner of the state, with the heaviest concentration of mink operations in Lake, Kane, and McHenry counties. Only a few operations are located out of this main area. Illinois ranks twelfth nationally in mink pelt production. Production of mink pelts in Illinois decreased one percent in 1999 to 49,300 pelts. Females bred to produce kits in 2000 totaled 12,800, unchanged from the number females bred to produce kits in 1999.

<u>HONEY:</u> Illinois honey production in 1999 from producers with five or more colonies totaled 594,000 pounds, down seven percent from 1998. Prices for 1999 Illinois honey averaged \$1.15 per pound, down three cents from the 1998 price. The total value of honey production was \$683,000, down ten percent from 1998. Prices are based on retail sales by producers and sales to private processors and cooperatives.
