

Illinois Hogs and Pigs

Released June 29, 2022

Illinois inventory of all hogs and pigs on June 1, 2022 was 5.30 million head, unchanged from March 1, 2022 and unchanged from last year. **Breeding inventory**, at 620,000 head, was up 30,000 from the previous quarter but down 30,000 from last year. **Market hog inventory**, at 4.68 million head, was down 1 percent from last quarter but up 1 percent from last year.

The March-May 2022 pig crop, at 2.84 million head, was up 1 percent from 2021. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 265,000 head, up 5,000 from a year ago. The average pigs saved per litter was 10.70 for the March-May period, compared with 10.85 last year.


