

## **Illinois Sheep and Goats**

## Released January 31, 2023

**All sheep and lamb inventory** on January 1, 2023, at 53,000 head, is unchanged from January 1, 2022. Breeding sheep inventory, at 45,000 head, is unchanged from last year. Market sheep and lambs on January 1, 2023, totaled 8,000 head, unchanged from January 1, 2022. The 2022 lamb crop of 41,000 head was unchanged from 2021.

**Wool production** during 2022 totaled 150,000 pounds, down 6 percent from 2021. Sheep and lambs shorn totaled 25,000 head, down 4 percent from 2021.

Meat and all other goat inventory totaled 22,000 head on January 1, 2023, down 4 percent from the previous year. Milk goat inventory, at 9,600 head, is up 14 percent from January 1, 2022.
