2022 Census of Agriculture underway in Maryland

ANNAPOLIS, MD - The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) mailed the 2022 Census of Agriculture paper questionnaires to all known agriculture producers across the nation and Puerto Rico. Last month, producers in the states received their survey codes with an invitation to respond online. Any Maryland producer who did not respond online now has the option to complete the ag census at <u>agcounts.usda.gov</u> or by mail. Producers who have already responded to the 2022 Census of Agriculture online do not need to respond again. The deadline for response is Feb. 6, 2023.

"We need to hear every producer's story. Their information matters and every response allow us to accurately tell a comprehensive story about the health and welfare of U.S. agriculture," said Shareefah Williams, state statistician of the USDA National Agricultural Statistics Service, Maryland field office. "Every response is a farmer's or rancher's right and opportunity to be heard and counted. They help us by sharing their story."

The Census of Agriculture remains the nation's only comprehensive and impartial agriculture data for every state, county, and U.S. territory. Farm operations of all sizes, urban and rural, which produced and sold, or normally would have sold, \$1,000 or more of agricultural products in 2022, are included in the ag census. The data inform decisions about policy, programs, rural development, research, and more. The Census of Agriculture is the producer's voice in the future of American agriculture.

Responding to the Census of Agriculture is required by law under Title 7 USC 2204(g) Public Law 105-113. The same law requires NASS to keep all information confidential, to use the data only for statistical purposes, and only publish in aggregate form to prevent disclosing the identity of any individual producer or farm operation. NASS will release the results of the ag census in 2024.
