## Michigan Farm Numbers

The number of farms in Michigan in 2023 was 45,300, according to Marlo D. Johnson, Director of the USDA, NASS, Great Lakes Regional Office. Land in farms was 9.5 million acres, unchanged from last year. The average size farm in Michigan was 210 acres per farm, up from 208 acres in 2022.

The number of farms in the United States for 2023 is estimated at 1,894,950, down 5,700 farms from 2022. Total land in farms, at 878,560,000 acres, decreased 1,100,000 acres from 2022. The average farm size for 2023 is 464 acres, up from 463 acres the previous year.

A farm is defined as any establishment from which \$1,000 or more of agricultural products were produced and sold, or normally would have been sold during the year. The \$1,000 threshold can be met by any combination of sales and government payments. Land in farms includes: crop and livestock acreage, wasteland, woodland, pasture, land in summer fallow, idle cropland, land enrolled in the Conservation Reserve Program, and other set-aside or commodity acreage programs.
