

# Missouri Crop Progress and Condition

Released February 26, 2024

For the month of February, temperatures averaged 43.9 degrees, 10.0 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 0.64 inches, 1.23 inches below normal. Topsoil moisture supply rated 3 percent very short, 24 percent short, and 73 percent adequate. Subsoil moisture supply rated 11 percent very short, 27 percent short, and 62 percent adequate. Wheat condition rated 1 percent poor, 30 percent fair, 62 percent good, and 7 percent excellent.

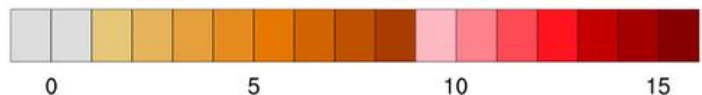
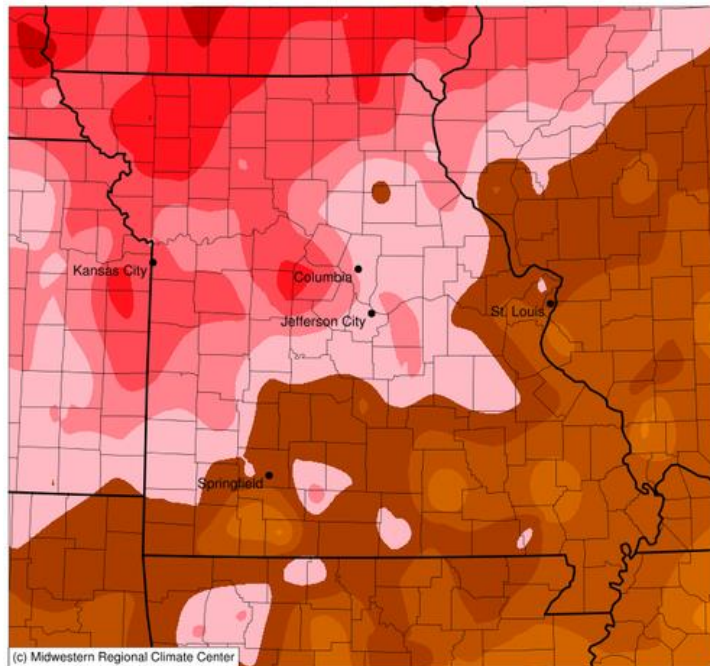

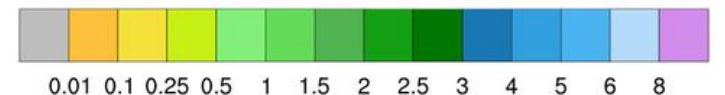
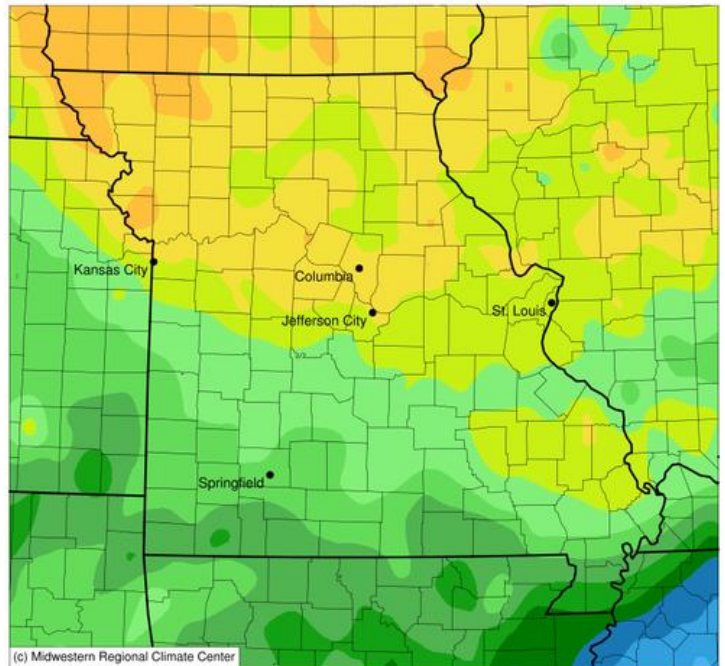
