



Missouri Hogs and Pigs

Released June 29, 2022

Missouri inventory of all hogs and pigs on June 1, 2022 was 3.20 million head, down 4 percent from March 1, 2022 and down 2 percent from last year. **Breeding inventory**, at 430,000 head, was up 10,000 from the previous quarter and up 5,000 from last year. **Market hog inventory**, at 2.77 million head, was down 5 percent from last quarter and down 2 percent from last year.

The March-May 2022 pig crop, at 2.41 million head, was down 2 percent from 2021. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 225,000 head, unchanged from a year ago. The average pigs saved per litter was 10.70 for the March-May period, compared with 10.90 last year.

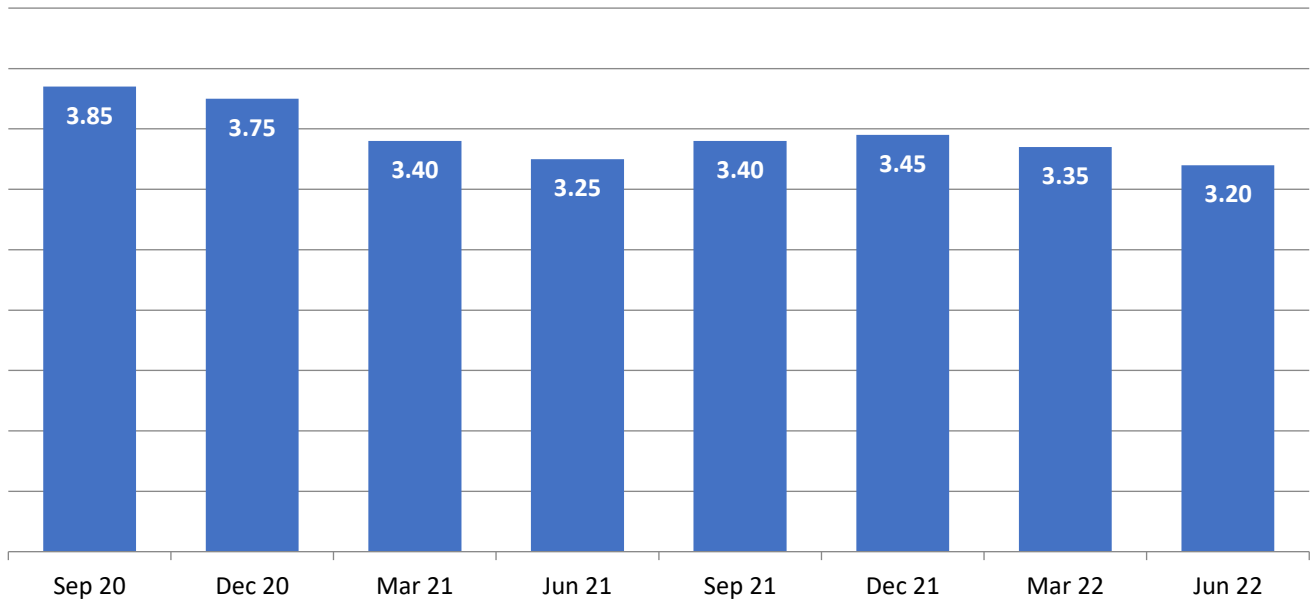
