



Missouri Hogs and Pigs

Released December 23, 2022

Missouri inventory of all hogs and pigs on December 1, 2022 was 3.20 million head, down 3 percent from September 1, 2022 and down 7 percent from last year. **Breeding inventory**, at 430,000 head, was unchanged from the previous quarter but up 10,000 from last year. **Market hog inventory**, at 2.77 million head, was down 3 percent from last quarter and down 9 percent from last year.

The September-November 2022 pig crop, at 2.41 million head, was down 4 percent from 2021. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 215,000 head, down 10,000 from a year ago. The average pigs saved per litter was 11.20 for the September-November period, unchanged from last year.

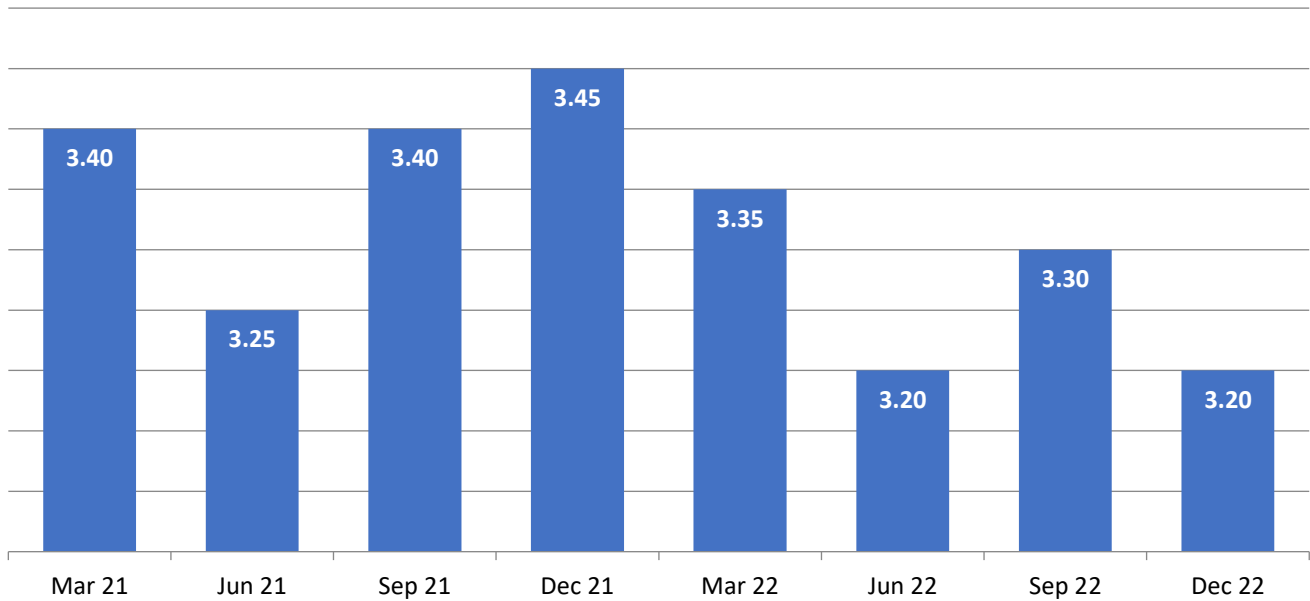
