



Missouri Grain Stocks

Released March 31, 2023

Corn stocks in all positions on March 1, 2023 totaled 250 million bushels, up 23 percent from March 1, 2022. On-farm stocks totaled 160 million bushels, while off-farm stocks totaled 89.9 million bushels. The December 2022 - February 2023 indicated disappearance is 111 million bushels.

Soybean stocks in all positions on March 1, 2023 totaled 126 million bushels, up 28 percent from March 1, 2022. On-farm stocks totaled 71.0 million bushels, while off-farm stocks totaled 54.6 million bushels. The December 2022 - February 2023 indicated disappearance is 74.5 million bushels.

All wheat stocks in all positions on March 1, 2023 totaled 14.0 million bushels, down 5 percent from March 1, 2022. On-farm stocks totaled 1.65 million bushels, while off-farm stocks totaled 12.3 million bushels. The December 2022 - February 2023 indicated disappearance is 7.75 million bushels.
