



U.S. American Indian Agriculture at a Glance

The 2017 Census of Agriculture shows us that U.S. farmers and ranchers are becoming more diverse and that the number of American Indian or Alaska Native farm operators continues to rise.

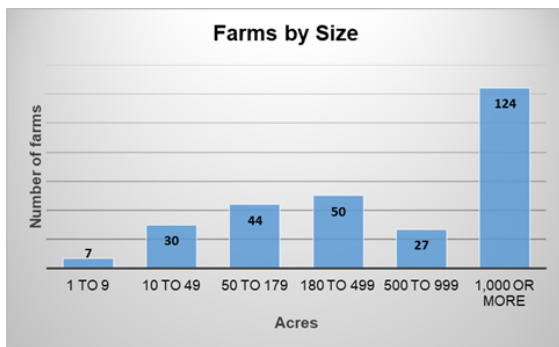
The 2017 Census counted a total of 79,198 American Indian or Alaska Native operators 60,038 on farms and ranches across the United States.

When compared to all farms nationwide, those with American Indian or Alaska Native principal operators tend to be smaller in terms of sales but significantly larger in size. These operations are also less likely to have Internet access.

Crow Reservation Farm Numbers

The Crow reservation contains **282** farms in total.

Land in farms is a total of **3,039,088** acres.



The market value of agriculture products sold for Crow reservation was **92,875,000**

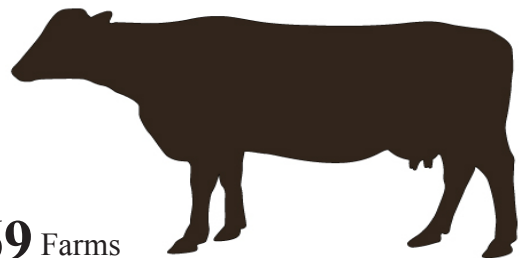
Farms that planted

held an inventory of Cattle and Calves reaching **111,809** head.

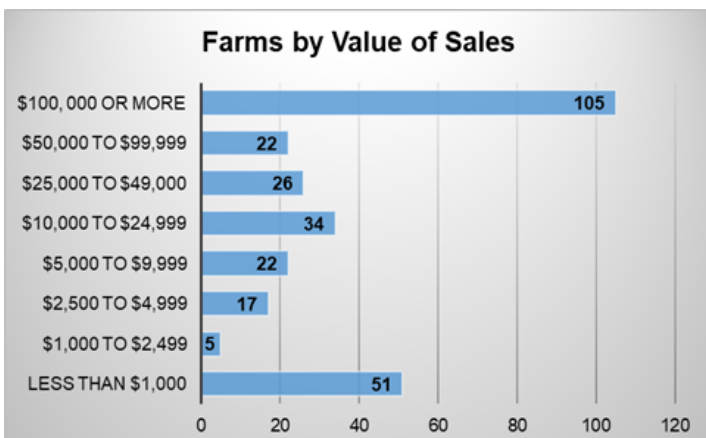
