CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION WEEK ENDING APRIL 26, 2015

AGRICULTURAL SUMMARY: The week began warm and sunny allowing producers good seeding conditions but turned cold and wet by the weekend. The moisture much of the State received was very welcome although more will be needed consistently to maintain current conditions. Mild daytime conditions have allowed producers to get out into the fields with 5.8 days suitable for fieldwork this week and planting is well ahead of last year at this time. Spring wheat has begun emerging with 4 percent emerged, ahead of the five year average and this time last year. Livestock producers began to move cattle and sheep to summer pastures in a few areas but reporters noted that there is still significant mountain snow pack in some areas which is keeping animals on supplemental feed.
