CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 18, 2015

AGRICULTURAL SUMMARY: Montana was dry and cool for much of the week before seeing a return to warmer daytime temperatures toward the end of the week. High temperatures ranged from the upper 60s to the upper 80s but most stations had freezing lows that ranged from the mid teens to mid 30s with very few stations reporting measurable precipitation. Corn harvest continues for both grain and silage with 41 percent of corn for grain and 95 percent of corn for silage harvested, which is ahead of the 5-year averages of 23 percent and 93 percent respectively. Sugarbeet harvest progressed with 46 percent which is behind last year's 49 percent and the 5-year average of 54 percent. Potato producers are harvesting with 76 percent harvested, which is ahead of both last year's 55 percent and the 5-year average of 74 percent. Winter wheat seedings are behind last year at this time but remain ahead of the 5-year average despite less than ideal precipitation levels in many areas with 95 percent seeded and 77 percent emerged. Pasture and range conditions were unchanged from the previous week with 19 percent rated good to excellent which remains well behind last year's 53 percent and the 5-year average of 40 percent. Producers continue to move livestock off summer ranges ahead of normal with 69 percent of cattle and 80 percent of sheep moved compared with a 5-year average of 62 percent and 72 percent, respectively.
