CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 25, 2015

AGRICULTURAL SUMMARY: Montana had a week of mild, fall conditions with scattered precipitation and high temperatures ranging from the upper 50s to the lower 80s and lows ranging from the lower teens to lower 30s. Most stations in the state received measurable precipitation, with the exception of much of the north central region, and the highest amount recorded this week was in Wilsall with 1.02 inches of moisture. Overall, it was a good week for fall harvest of crops still being harvested around the state. Corn harvested for grain is well underway with 50 percent harvested, which is behind last year's 61 percent but ahead of the 5-year average of 35 percent. Sugarbeet harvest continues with 69 percent, which is behind last year's 62 percent but behind the 5-year average of 85 percent. Winter wheat emergence is at 84 percent, which is behind of last year's 88 percent but ahead of the 5-year average of 67 percent. Pasture and range conditions were unchanged from the previous week with 19 percent rated good to excellent, which remains well behind last year's 52 percent and the 5-year average of 40 percent. Producers continue to move livestock off summer ranges ahead of normal with 79 percent of cattle and 86 percent of sheep moved compared with a 5-year average of 72 percent and 80 percent, respectively.
