2010 Grazing Fee Rates for Montana and the United States

Grazing fees paid by Montana producers for grazing livestock on privately owned, non-irrigated grazing land were unchanged for cow-calf pairs, but higher for AUM and on a per-head basis in 2010, according to USDA, National Agricultural Statistics Service, Montana Field Office. Cattle producers paid \$20.20 per cow-calf pair in 2010, unchanged from the previous year. The average fee paid for grazing livestock on an AUM (animal unit month) basis was \$18.40 per month, up \$0.40 from last year. Grazing fee rates charged on a per head basis were \$19.30 per month, up \$0.40 from last year.

In the 17 states that estimate grazing fees in the United States, the AUM grazing rate was \$15.30 per month in 2010, up \$0.70 from the previous year. The cow-calf rate was \$17.90 per month, up \$0.90 from 2009, and the per head rate, at \$16.60 per month, was up \$1.10 from 2009.

All grazing fees are for privately-owned, non-irrigated grazing land. Rates charged for public land, irrigated land, and harvested cropland were excluded. The AUM rate includes reported AUM rates plus reported cowcalf rates that were converted to an AUM basis. The cow-calf rate was converted to AUM basis using the following formula (1 AUM=cow-calf *0.833).
