According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New England, there were 6.0 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, September 1, 2019. Topsoil moisture supplies were 2 percent very short, 13 percent short, and 85 percent adequate. Subsoil moisture supplies were 1 percent very short, 11 percent short, and 88 percent adequate. Pasture conditions ranged from 1 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 46 percent fair, 29 percent good, and 17 percent excellent.

ALL MA COUNTIES, Tom Smiarowski

Good weather for field work. Harvest of pumpkins and winter squash underway.

BARNSTABLE/BRISTOL/DUKES/NANTUCKET/PLYMOUT H. Dr. Peter Jeranyama

The crop is progressing well and the fruit is sizing up and coloring. Cool night temperatures will be helpful for color formation. With rains anticipated from Hurricane Dorian, one has to cut back on irrigation, .Be sure the tile drains are working properly because excessive amount of rains might cause a flash flooding. I hope excessive high heat is now a thing of the past but we still have to watch for sun scald incidences on the ripening fruit.

PLYMOUTH, Steve Ward

Some well-timed rain has made for a good growing season for cranberries in Southeastern Massachusetts. The focus now will be on having enough water to flood the cranberry bogs for harvest.

NEW HAMPSHIRE

HILLSBOROUGH, George Hamilton

Fruit: Orchardists harvesting peaches, plums, and Paulared, Ginger Gold, Zestar and Honeycrisp apples. Orchardists busy monitoring for pests, mowing orchard floors, fixing up orchard roads and moving bins into the orchard. Also, orchardists are spraying stop drop materials to apples. Harvest late maturing highbush blueberry varieties and fall raspberry harvest continued. "Pick-your-own" operations gearing up to open, some over the Labor Day weekend and most will be opening next weekend. Vegetables: Growers are harvesting an array of vegetables: beans, beets, cole crops, cucumbers, greens, peas, potatoes, radishes, summer squash, sweet corn, tomatoes, zucchini, and other vegetables. Sweet corn growers are monitoring insect pressures and spraying accordingly. Planting crops on harvest vegetable fields. Northern Corn Leaf Blight symptoms seen on Ornamental Corn stalk leaves. Field Crops: Hay cutting continued during the week with the second and third

cuttings being made. Some spreading manure on hay fields. Farmers making new forage seedings.

ROCKINGHAM, Nada Haddad

Pick your own flowers going well; harvesting peaches, plums, apples (many different varieties) fall raspberries, onions and garlic, and whole array of vegetables and herbs. Some apple orchards are open for PYO but most of them will be open by mid-September once more apple varieties become available. Haying. Rain, some heavy at times on Wednesday in afternoon and evening. Fist part of Labor Day was good bringing steady traffic to apple orchards. Monday labor week-end was less busy as cloudy and rainy weather was prevalent on and off during the day. The week saw some cooler night (about 49 degree Fahrenheit)

Hints of fall are in the Franklin County VT air. Corn keeps plugging along and moving closer and closer to maturity. Long range forecast is for cooler temperatures and no frost which will allow for more time to finish corn. The key will be patience for the corn choppers.

This past week was mostly sunny and mild. The nights are noticeably cooler but the sun is still strong. The apple harvest is starting to get into full swing. The blueberry harvest is nearly complete and it appears like it was a good crop this year. Farmers are working on third cut hay. The corn crop has set ears but it will be awhile before it is mature enough to harvest. Corn varies from looking like an average crop to poor in some areas. Sweet corn is in full harvest with average yields.
