Good Week for Field Work: New York had an average of 4.5 days suitable for field work. Temperatures were cool this week. Some areas reported rain leading to harvesting difficulties. Silage and vegetable harvest is wrapping up, grain corn and soybean harvest continues. Grape harvest is ongoing including Merlot and Cabernet Franc. Winter wheat looks good with excess growth. Field activities for the week include cutting hay, chopping silage, applying fertilizer, plowing and planting of fields, mowing and baling hay, mowing pastures, spraying of trees and fixing machinery.

Broome County, Maria Heath

Drying conditions are ideal.

Franklin County, Jennifer Bosley

There is still some corn to be chopped. It was a very rainy week making it difficult for people to finish.

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties, Nathan R Herendeen

Wheat planting essentially done. Early wheat looks great, has excess growth. Grain corn and soy harvest continuing. Silage essentially done.

Ontario County, Joann Rogers

Fall harvest continues between rain events; yields of corn and soybean are being reported as average.

Orange County, Ford Barber

Orange County received reports of up to 1" of rain during the last week, which was much needed. Most vegetable crops have been harvested. The county has only received a single frost so far this season.

Schuyler/ Seneca Counties, Kathy Mastellar

Cool, moist weather has prevented harvest of soybeans & corn because they are not drying down. A frost is needed in some areas.

Suffolk County, Alice V Wise

Long Island grape growers harvested blocks of Merlot early in the week. Next week will see continued harvest of Merlot and Cabernet Franc.
