Good Week for Field Work: New York had an average of 4 days suitable for field work. Weather was typical this week: November rain, frost and some snow. Fall tillage is mostly complete as are the silage harvest, soybean harvest, and grape harvest. Corn grain harvest is moving more slowly, partially due to moisture problems. Despite the late harvest, yields on soybeans and grain corn look good. The winter wheat planting is nearing completion and the crop looks good as it enters dormancy. Field activities for the week include cutting hay, applying fertilizer, mowing and baling hay, mowing pastures, spraying of trees and fixing machinery.

# REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

### Broome/ Cortland/ Tioga/ Tompkins Counties, Janice Degni:

Snow and rain slowing down grain harvest. Weather is typical for November. We had a very cooperative fall to mature crops up to this point. I doubt all beans will be harvested, some acres will be lost because of late planting and late maturity.

### Clinton/ Essex/ Franklin/ St Lawrence Counties, Kitty O'Neil:

Good week for combining the last remaining corn and soybeans, though a small amount remain standing. Most fall tillage has been completed.

### **Cortland/Tompkins Counties, Jennifer Doty:**

First significant snow fall has arrived. Most corn silage has completed, soybean harvest is well underway or near completion, corn grain harvest is slow due to high moisture content.

#### Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties, Nathan R Herendeen:

Soybean harvest essentially done, few straggler fields left. Corn grain harvest continues when days are dry enough or cold enough. Yields have been excellent. Wheat looks great going into winter dormancy.

### Madison County, Jessica Pylman:

We had some snow but it did not seem to hinder harvesting too much.

### Oneida County, William Paddock:

The beginning of the week was great as we had two great days of weather, lots of soybeans and corn were combined. Soybeans are almost or are done in the county, corn for grain is very much still in progress. Moisture has dropped considerably the last two weeks so farmers are really trying to get as much done as they can now so they do not need to spend money to dry it down very far. Winter wheat and other small grains look very good. On Friday we had our first significant snow fall. We had from the southern part of the county an inch or less to the North West, where they had as much as six inches.

#### **Ontario County, Joann Rogers:**

Ontario County is starting to finish the soybean harvest and continues with the corn harvest. Average to above average yields have been reported on corn and soybeans.

#### Schuyler/ Seneca Counties, Kathy Mastellar:

Snow began to fall on Thursday and a county wide frost occurred on Thursday night. Wet snow then fell which halted corn harvest on Friday.

# Suffolk County, Alice V Wise:

In Long Island vineyards, the last blocks of red varieties were harvested this past week.
