**Good Week for Field Work:** New York had an average of 5 days suitable for field work. Cooler temperatures were reported throughout the state this week as well as a few reports of frost. It was a great week of harvest, corn silage harvest was reported as almost done and grain harvest is beginning. Soybean harvest continued this week with above average yield. Apples, grapes, and vegetables were also harvested. Nice weather in previous weeks allowed for third and fourth cutting of hay. Pasture are still regenerating but at a slower rate because of lack of moisture and end of season. Field activities for the week included plowing and planting of fields, fall tillage, harvesting, repair and maintenance.

# **REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County**

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

## **Broome County, Maria Heath:**

Corn drying down very quickly. Frost occurred where there was no fog.

## **Cortland County, Jennifer Doty:**

Silage harvest continues, some is being harvested ahead of maturity before the fields get too wet to support equipment, although ground remains very dry. Pastures are no longer regenerating due to lack of moisture and end of season. First threat of frost arrived.

#### Genesee County, Nathan R Herendeen:

Corn silage essentially done. Wheat planting well ahead of normal. Soy yields lower than the visual estimates. Harvest conditions for corn, soy have been excellent so far, same for wheat planting. Wheat stands are excellent, few weeds so far.

## **Hamilton Country, Andrew Michael:**

Here in Eastern Central New York including Schoharie, Schenectady, Albany, Montgomery, Fulton and Hamilton Counties hay harvest continues as people are getting some late hay of very good quality. Corn harvest is winding down for silage and is just beginning for grain. There have been a few fields of Soybeans harvested. No one feels comfortable talking about yields for grain. Silage yields were normal to a little better.

# **Ontario County, Joann Rogers:**

Ontario County continues with the soybean, corn, apples, grapes and vegetable harvest.

### Oneida County, William Paddock:

Corn silage harvest is basically over, we have a few stragglers refilling silos and those with extra corn are patiently awaiting an ag bag to fill. We have not had a frost or even a killing frost but nearly all the corn is brown and drying down on its own. We have reports of producers that are heavy into HMC harvest and others are doing dry shell with the stretch of nice weather and the way the corn plants are naturally drying down. Soybean harvest is going on as well as farmers are trying to get them in with the nice weather as well. Overall we hear that corn harvest is up and down and soybeans appear to be good to above average. A lot of third and fourth cutting grass has gone in lately with the nice weather and most alfalfa fourth cutting has gone in or producers are waiting for a killing frost before taking it. Small grain plantings have been going on as well and winter wheat is up as well. We are expecting rain this week with cooler weather so it will probably really get going then. Pastures that are rotationally grazed are still growing although at a much slower rate, still no frost to stop the growing on them either. Farmers are supplementing feed outside for cattle that are still out.

#### Seneca County, Kathy Mastellar:

Crop harvest continued through the week.

## Suffolk County, Alice V Wise:

Wine grape harvest continued in Long Island vineyards this week. Growers are beginning to harvest Merlot, one of Long Island's signature red varieties.
