Good Week for Field Work: New York had an average of 5 days suitable for field work. Fall grain harvest continued throughout the state. Rain was reported in some counties but it did not delay grain harvest. Farmers are nearing the end of corn grain harvests. Soy harvest is reported as nearly completed. Yield highly variable for both crops. Winter wheat, pasture and hay crops are reported as in good condition. Field activities for the week included fall tillage, harvesting, repair and maintenance.

REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

Albany/Fulton/Hamilton Counties, Andrew Michael:

Here in Eastern Central New York including Schoharie, Schenectady, Albany, Montgomery, Fulton and Hamilton Counties fall harvest is still underway with corn for grain and soybeans, corn silage is all done. There is still hay being mowed whenever we have a two day window. You see a lot of cover cropping coming up on what used to be fall plowed ground.

Cayuga County, Keith Severson:

Winter cropping season over, lights out, spread manure.

Cortland/Tompkins Counties, Jennifer Doty:

Harvest continues. Much needed rain arrived, but mud hinders combine progress. Animals still on pasture, but supplemented.

Chemung/Cortland/Tioga/Tompkins Counties, Janice Degni:

We have had a remarkable fall weather to support harvest activities. Corn and beans dried well in the field. Lots of late season corn below 20% moisture. There have only been a few rain events so progress has been regular and amazingly with no snow to speak of. Late cutting hay pretty much done. Cover crops growing well.

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties, Nathan R Herendeen:

Near the end on corn grain harvest, yields are good, but not excellent. Soy harvest nearly complete, yields highly variable. Winter wheat looking very good, should be going to winter dormancy, but warm weather continues to support new tiller and leaf development. Pasture and hay crops looking good for winter. Soil is not saturated.

Oneida County, William Paddock:

Another pretty good week for our producers to be finishing up grain harvest. We continue to hear reports of producers that are very close to being done or just finished this past week. We hear of small patches of soybeans left, on wet fields that producers need to be careful about getting on but soybeans are almost completed. Corn continues to be combined and reports are that it is yielding very good with very good test weights as well. Corn is also very near the end, although some may have to continue standing in the field as bins are full. Hope everyone has a very good Thanksgiving!

Ontario County, Joann Rogers:

Ontario County had another mild week of weather to continue with fall harvest and tillage.

Rensselaer/Saratoga/Warren/Washington Counties, David Holck:

Corn grain and soybean yields have been good in our counties this fall.
