Poor Week for Field Work: New York had an average of 1.5 days suitable for field work.

Though there was little snow this week, there was plenty of rain, ensuring that most fields stayed either too frozen or too wet for any major activity, though some manure spreading and some fertilizer application has been reported.

Maple season is wrapping up. A few producers are still flowing. Long Island grapes are being tied off.

Field activities for the week include spreading manure and fertilizer, repair and maintenance, and spring prep work.

REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

Broome County, Maria Heath:

Standing water on fields on river flats. Temperatures still cool, still seeing snow flurries. Manure being spread on gravel ground.

Columbia/ Dutchess/ Greene/ Putnam/ Ulster/ Westchester, Sandy Ferry: With the rain and warmer temperatures things are finally starting to look and feel like spring. Green tip is expected for fruit trees starting later this week. Our orchards are busy gearing up for spraying and finishing pruning. We are hoping that we do not have too much winter damage for the stone fruit but we should know soon. Our crop farmers are finishing manure application and getting ready to start spring work as soon as it dry enough to be in the fields.

Cortland/ Tompkins Counties, Jennifer Doty:

Fields remain too wet to begin spring work, some farmers finding manure spreading now more difficult than during the deep snow. A few stubborn snow piles remain. Maple season has ended for most with half of normal production, but few producers are still getting sap flows with the snow pack in the woods assisting. Syrup has rated Light, little to none Medium or Dark, but with good flavor.

Essex County, David Reckahn:

finally warming up but still had snow during the week and frost still in the soil

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties, Nathan R Herendeen:

Some application of Nitrogen on wheat and grass hay completed, about 15 % Weather has prevented most field activity - pea, oat, barley, forage seedings have not started with a few exceptions. Some frost seedings in wheat have been done.

Madison County, Jessica Pylman:

Madison County had approx 3 days of rain last week. Lower elevation have no real snow cover left as of this weekend, however; hilltop and higher elevations still had some snow packs and banks left in and along the fields. The fields are either still frozen or just too wet to do any field work at this time.

Oneida County, William Paddock:

We finally strung together some nice days with some heat as well. Still not much going on in the county as far as field work. Nearly all the snow is gone except for in low spots in the fields and in the woods, also some snow in the higher elevations of the county in the fields but it is melting quickly. I would expect to see some progress on the winter wheat this week and hopefully I will have an update on it next week, as the weather forecast looks promising. Some producers are picking and choosing spots to spread liquid manure as pits are quite full and some said last week they are hoping to put on some fertilizer this week. Let's hope the sunny days and heat continue to ramp up this week.

Ontario County, Joann Rogers:

Producers are now just able to spread manure, repair fences and starting to get prepared for spring field work.

Otsego County, Lisa Knapp:

Ground is still too soft. No field work at this time.

Rensselaer/ Saratoga/ Warren/ Washington, David Holck:

Our counties in eastern New York finally had temperatures in the 60's over the weekend. There is still snow along some of the hedgerows in a few places. Dairy farmers are spreading manure, but field conditions have been too wet for tillage to begin.

Schuyler/ Seneca Counties, Kathy Mastellar:

Rain and cool weather still hampered any field work.

Suffolk County, Alice V Wise:

Grapevines on Long Island are in the dormant stage. Growers are tying vines to the trellis wire and getting equipment ready.
