<u>Fair Week for Field Work:</u> New York had an average of 3.5 days suitable for field work.

Though conditions vary across the state, weather was largely good and some fields have dried enough for fieldwork. Reports on perennials and fall plantings are positive.

Field activities for the week include spreading manure and fertilizer, plowing and planting, spraying trees, repair and maintenance, and spring prep work.

Albany/ Fulton/ Hamilton/ Montgomery/ Schenectady/ Schoharie Counties, Andrew Michael:

In the 6 county region of New York; Albany, Schenectady, Schoharie, Montgomery, Fulton and Hamilton Counties there was everything from plowing has begun to the ground still has snow cover. Things are looking up across the region however.

Broome County, Maria Heath:

Fields dried up some. Plowing has started on some fields.

Capital Region Counties, Laura Mcdermott:

last week's weather was a boon to all specialty crops growers. Fields drying out and ground warming - no issues with flooding and perennial crops made great progress. Hudson Valley is moving forward nicely, capital district will gain quickly if weather stays warm. North country still waking up from winter!

Cayuga/ Onondaga/ Oswego Counties, Krista Tyrrell:

Conditions remain very wet this week in Cayuga, Onondaga and Oswego Counties. We are starting to see some manure spread on the larger dairy farms, but very little. Rain twice this week continued to keep things too wet to complete field work.

Clinton/ Essex/ Franklin/ St Lawrence Counties, Kitty O'Neil:

Hay fields and pastures just beginning to green up slightly. Alfalfa and grass condition not completely apparent yet.

Columbia/ Dutchess/ Greene/ Putnam/ Ulster/ Westchester Counties, Sandy Ferry:

Last week was a beautiful week in the Hudson Valley. Apples were being sprayed and some varieties were in green tip by the end of the week. Oats and barley was planted in some areas and fall seeded grains have started to emerge and look good.

Cortland/Tompkins Counties, Jennifer Doty:

Plows finally went in the ground this week. Manure is being spread widely now that fields have dried enough to withstand equipment.

Erie County, Emily M Dechow:

Erie County reached the 70 degree mark this week, but field conditions remain wet.

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties, Nathan R Herendeen:

Field activity started on well drained soils, but most fields still too wet for field activity. Some nitrogen application on winter wheat and grass hay, some planting of peas, oats, and new forage crop seedings. It is getting late...

Lewis County, Joe Lawrence:

It was a good week for drying soil. A small amount of field work began.

Livingston County, Dean Pendergast Dir:

Spring tillage has started in a few areas of the county and some of the first peas have been planted.

Madison County, Jessica Pylman:

We're starting to see more and more freshly tilled fields. This past week and weekend gave those with well drained soils a chance to start tillage work and even start planting. I've seen some oats and new seeding go in late this past week. Talking to some farmers their subsoil is still too wet to start field work.

Oneida County, William Paddock:

What a great week in Oneida County! We finally saw some heat, sun and plenty of days of nice weather. All the snow is now gone in the fields but some can still be seen in the woods and along the roadside in areas that do not see much sun. I would expect all snow to be gone with the rains that are due early this week. Some plowing going on and manure spreading going on as well as pits are getting quite full. Moisture of the topsoil is fairly dry so most people are not having much trouble going. No report on winter wheat or hay stands as they are just starting to green up, too early to report on them.

Ontario County, Joann Rogers:

Field preparation has started in some fields; manure spreading was being done towards the end of the week.

Otsego County, Lisa Knapp:

Last week brought great weather. Producers have been spreading manure.

Rensselaer/ Saratoga/ Warren/ Washington Counties, David Holck:

Our area had a nice week with warm temperatures. Farmers were able to spread manure and tillage has begun on fields that were dry enough to work.

Schuyler/ Seneca Counties, Kathy Mastellar:

Fields are still too wet to work due to a couple of days with some rain.

Suffolk County, Alice V Wise:

Buds are starting to swell in Long Island vineyards. With warm, sunny weather predicted for the weekend, things will move quickly.
