<u>Good Week for Field Work:</u> New York had an average of 5.5 days suitable for field work.

New York had a sunny warm week, allowing for high levels of field activity. There were lots of reports of tillage, planting, and application of fertilizer and manure. Though it's too early to tell in some areas, reports on winter wheat and hay are positive. It was also a *TREE*-mendous week for apples and sweet cherries, which really responded to the nice weather.

Field activities for the week include spreading manure and fertilizer, plowing and planting, spraying trees, repair and maintenance, and spring prep work.

REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

Albany/ Fulton/ Hamilton/ Montgomery/ Schenectady/ Schoharie Counties, Andrew Michael:

Here in central eastern NY, Hamilton, Fulton, Montgomery, Schoharie, Schenectady and Albany counties in the valleys plowing is underway, hay seedings are going in and I heard of corn being planted, have not seen that myself. In the uplands it is finally drying out so that plowing will begin.

Broome County, Maria Heath:

Good weather promoted a lot of field work. Warm weather has spurred on growth of grass and trees budding. Fields drying out quickly with the warmth and wind.

Cayuga County, Keith Severson:

Just warming up so we can get started here

Cayuga/ Onondaga/ Oswego Counties, Krista Tyrrell:

Oswego County remains wet with some large piles of snow still present in cooler, shaded areas. Onondaga and Cayuga County producers have been very busy this week with spreading manure and some field work. Temperatures and sunshine this week have helped get things started!

Columbia/ Dutchess/ Greene/ Putnam/ Ulster/ Westchester Counties, Sandra Ferry:

The weather was beautiful this past week and this week looks even better. Orchards are busy spraying as most trees are in green tip or later. The new seedings and small grains are being planted and some corn is in the ground. With little rain predicted for the coming week there will be a great deal of field work getting done.

Cortland/ Tompkins Counties, Jennifer Doty:

A week of dry, beautiful weather has field work moving along. Plowing and disking, seedings being planted, corn just starting to go in. Top soil starting to get dry in some areas while wet pockets remain in others.

Delaware County, Mariane Kiraly:

Fence fixing, tillage and spring grains going in as weather warmed and fields dried up. Pastures are later than usual by 1-2 weeks.

Erie County, Emily M Dechow:

Above average temps and clear days allowed field work to progress in Erie County this week.

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties, Nathan R Herendeen:

Rapid increase in field activity - planting oats, barley, peas, forage crop seedings and corn. Wheat and alfalfa growing rapidly.

Livingston County, Dean R Pendergast:

Field conditions have improved greatly and several planters have hit the field.

Madison County, Jessica Pylman:

The weather has been very co-operative and we've seen a lot of ground turned over and planted in the last week.

Oneida County, William Paddock:

What great week! Farmers are really out and going at it now. We are seeing lots of tillage going on now. Lots of discing, chisel and mold board plowing going on. We have not heard or seen any corn in the ground yet, but we are seeing lots of hay and oat seedings in. Winter wheat is very green and a number of farmers are or would like to put nitrogen on the wheat very soon. Too early still to get an idea of how alfalfa and hay stands made it through winter. We could really use a nice easy all day rain though as the topsoil is becoming quite dry.

Ontario County, Joann Rogers:

Ontario County had a very busy week with field preparation, spreading manure and some early planting of corn and soybeans.

Rensselaer/ Saratoga/ Warren/ Washington Counties, David Holck:

We had a total of 2.1 inches of rain for April and no rain at all last week. Farmers have been able to get in new seedings and a little corn has been planted. We could use some rain to bring on the first cutting hay and help germinate the new seedings.

Schuyler/ Seneca Counties, Kathy Mastellar:

Field work is finally in full progress and planting has begun!

Suffolk County, Alice V Wise:

On Long Island, Young vines and vineyards on lighter soils have considerable budswell. Budbreak is not far off.
