Excellent Week for Field Work: New York had an average of 6 days suitable for field work.

Another sunny warm week in New York! With the change in the weather fields are drying out and a lot of field work is going on. Crops are recovering quickly, though the heavy moisture appears to have left some wet spots. There is some uncertainty in yields. Most areas are reporting good to excellent, but a few are reporting low yields. Insect pests have been reported in small quantities. Field activities for the week included spreading manure and fertilizer, plowing and planning, spraying tress, repair and maintenance.

Cortland/ Tompkins Counties, Jennifer Doty:

More dry hay continues, catching up on late first cutting and a few working into third cutting. Corn height and stages vary widely, but heat and dry weather has improved most stands.

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties, Nathan R Herendeen:

Wheat harvest essentially done. Good crop, good quality, many excellent yields, short straw. Oat harvest underway, quality looks good. Dry hay harvest catching up, but still far behind normal. Corn and soy have made remarkable recovery from wet soils of June & early July. Few corn rootworm beetles, few soy aphid, few alfalfa leaf hopper.

Livingston County, Dean R Pendergast:

Crops have shown improvement with the recent increase in temperatures. Wheat harvest continues as well as snap beans.

Madison County, Shelby Henty:

The weather has made a change for the better. With the sunshine and heat upon us there has been a lot of field activity. Corn has started to tassel in some places and second cutting is in progress or has finished up.

Oneida County, William Paddock:

What a week! We had one day in the past week with scattered showers so lots of haying going on. Pretty much first cutting is done except for a few wet spots and those that are doing bedding. Second and some third cutting has been done and all indications are that they have been very good, quality and quantity wise. Corn has really been jumping and we are not seeing nearly the variation in height that we were. Nearly all fields have tasseled and they are dark green now as well. Soybeans look fantastic, winter wheat harvest is basically done. Oats are very close to starting harvest either this week or next. Pastures look good but have slowed down due to the heat and lack of rain the last two weeks.

Ontario County, Joann Rogers:

Ontario County was able to make some dry hay this week and the wheat harvest continued. The corn and soybean fields have uneven maturity and several areas where the crop drowned out.

Schuyler/ Seneca Counties, Kathy Mastellar:

No rain this week. Crops being harvested are producing low yields. Fields still remain wet in some areas.
