Excellent Week for Field Work: New York had an average of 6.5 days suitable for field work.

More warm dry weather made for a lot of field work this past week. There are no more reports of excess moisture, yellowing, or wet spots. However, the dry conditions have led to a few reports of curling corn and tough pastures. Yields and conditions are all described as good to excellent.

Field activities for the week included spreading manure and fertilizer, plowing and planting, spraying trees, repair and maintenance.

REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

Chemung/ Cortland/ Tioga/ Tompkins Counties, Janice Degni:

Excellent weather for the week. Lots of haying done. Corn growing. Early corn filling kernels. Late corn not pollinating yet. Spring small grain harvest progressing. Soil is getting dry and pasture regrowth much slower.

Cortland/ Tompkins Counties, Jennifer Doty:

Another week of dry hay production. Corn is tassel stage at various heights, some at silk stage.

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties, Nathan R Herendeen:

Corn and soy continue to improve, have had just enough moisture and heat to keep everything growing well in this area. New forage crop seedings (alfalfa-grass) being planted, conditions good. Oat harvest continuing rapidly. Wheat and oat straw yields and quality good.

Madison County, Shelby Henty:

The weather has been great the past few weeks and has been excellent to get second cutting in. With a few light showers here and there around the county the crops are doing well.

Oneida County, William Paddock:

Another fantastic week of weather, although now we could use a nice steady shot of rain for a day or two. The good news is that 3rd cutting alfalfa is cut and has been tremendous all summer. Second and third cutting grass hay is moving right along with all of the good weather, lots of square baling going on. Soybeans look amazing as well as oats and oats are very close to being harvested this week or next. Winter wheat harvest is done and overall was very good according to producers. Corn overall looks good now, we have heard of a few farmers that say they have seen a little curling going on. We continue to have heavy dews each morning which may help us until we get some much needed rain. Rotationally grazed pastures look good but could use a shot of rain but regular pastures are looking a little tough right now and could really use some rain.

Ontario County, Joann Rogers:

Ontario County was busy with making dry hay this week with finally some dry days in a row.

Rensselaer/ Saratoga/ Warren/ Washington Counties, David Holck:

Our counties had a very dry May, a very wet June, normal rainfall for July, and August has been dry so far. With most corn in tassel, we could use some timely rains to fill out the ears. Corn is showing stress and starting to curl on shallow soils. The dry weather during the past 10 days has allowed a lot of producers to catch up on harvesting hay, haylage, and baleage.

Schuyler/ Seneca Counties, Kathy Mastellar:

Wheat harvest continued and oats are beginning to be harvested. Forage crops are continuing as well.

Suffolk County, Alice V Wise:

Long Island grape growers are hedging excessive shoot growth and removing cluster zone leaves in preparation for application of protective bird netting.
