<u>Good Week for Field Work:</u> New York had an average of 5 days suitable for field work.

New York weather varied this week. Most area reported scattered showers which improved conditions for field crops such as corn, soybean, and wheat. A few places reported another dry week but only some corn and soybeans curling was reported. Hay and pasture conditions is reported as good to excellent. Field activities for the week included spreading manure and fertilizer, plowing and planting, spraying trees, repair and maintenance.

August 16, 2015 New York Weekly Weather Summary

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

Broome County, Maria Heath:

Good week for harvesting dry hay. Oats being harvested.

Cortland/ Tompkins Counties, Jennifer Doty:

Mostly dry weather improved dry hay progress, but some areas are starting to need rain. Pastures are in mid-summer slump without rain. Oat harvest has begun. Corn stages still vary widely.

Essex County, Dave Reckahn:

Still had very little open window for hay harvested but many farms got in some additional hay harvest this weekend but many still behind and just getting first cutting.

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties, Nathan R Herendeen:

Adequate moisture and high temps continue to improve outlook for corn and soybeans. Wheat yields and quality in this area were excellent. Oat yields were excellent. Hay and pasture continue to improve with adequate moisture and heat. Fantastic improvement in everything since mid-July!!!

Lewis County, Joe Lawrence:

Much of the area received a much needed slow soaking rain last week that resulted in around 1 inch precipitation. Though we still remain dry and another rain of this nature in the near future would be great.

Livingston County, Dean R Pendergast:

Many acres of crops benefited from a good rain. Isolated areas in the county reported significant rainfall but no damage reported to date.

Madison County, Shelby Henty:

Last week we finally received some needed scattered showers throughout the county. All crops are coming along nicely after the weather we had in the spring. This week with the humid temperatures people should be able to finish getting their second cutting off along with starting their third cutting. There has also been a lot of combining oats going on throughout the county.

Oneida County, William Paddock:

Another hot, dry week in Oneida county. We could use a nice steady rain for a day or two. We continue to have heavy dews each morning which I think are keeping things going. We have had some reports of a little curling of corn and even some soybeans. Overall though soybeans look fantastic and most corn is looking pretty good as well. We still will not though just how good it is until harvest. Alfalfa stands look great and producers who were aggressive in the spring are awaiting 4th cutting which looks tremendous again just as 1st, 2nd, and 3rd looked. Winter wheat is basically all harvested and reports are that it was a little uneven, some good fields and some not so good. Oat harvest is just beginning and we have not heard anything yet on how it is going. Rotationally grazed pastures continue to look good as long as producers have been giving a long enough rest. Regular pastures are looking in need of rain.

Ontario County, Joann Rogers:

Wheat harvest was wrapping up, while the oats/barley harvest started this week in Ontario County.

Rensselaer/ Saratoga/ Warren/ Washington Counties, David Holck:

We had a series of thunderstorms last week that dropped varying amounts of rainfall on our 4 counties. Some areas had a few inches of rainfall and others only got a trace. Crop conditions vary based on rainfall, soil type, and management.

Schuyler/ Seneca Counties, Kathy Mastellar:

Rain a few days this week, but warm days.

Suffolk County, Alice V Wise:

In Long Island vineyards, the ripening period has begun. Growers are applying protective netting so that losses to hungry birds are minimized.
