Excellent Week for Field Work: New York had an average of 7 days suitable for field work.

Another sunny hot week in NY has led to some reports of curling and stress conditions, but most areas also report the dry weather allowing for rapid harvest progress in hay. Apple, grape, and silage harvest are beginning. Despite the heat stress most crops are reported in good condition. Field activities for the week included fall tillage, winter planting, harvest, repair and maintenance.

Broome County, Maria Heath:

Great week to get dry hay in. Ground is getting very dry.

Cortland/ Tompkins Counties, Jennifer Doty:

Continued dry weather has halted pasture regrowth, but dry hay harvest has caught up. Persistent humidity hinders combining of oats and straw baling. Corn silage harvest has begun.

Delaware County, Mariane Kiraly:

Rain is needed.

Essex County, David Reckahn:

A great week for harvesting hay. Most of the 1st cut grasses were completed finally

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties, Nathan R Herendeen:

Weather continues hot and dry. Few widely scattered showers. Hay harvest proceeding rapidly. Corn silage harvest starting slowly, needs a little more maturity. Soils showing dry/stress conditions for first time this summer.

Livingston County, Dean R Pendergast:

Producers have started chopping corn, not in full swing but nicely getting started. Heat is helping crops finish.

Oneida County, William Paddock:

Another hot, dry week. We are starting to see and hear reports of corn curling slightly, as well as some soybeans. Soybeans have really started to drop leaves as they are really drying down. Corn actually looks pretty good considering all of the heat and how dry it has been. We would not be surprised to see some corn being harvested this week, for silage or HMC. Lots of second and third cutting hay was done this past week again. Small grain harvest is basically done and we have seen some wheat and rye planted for next year as well. Pastures are really looking for a drink of water. Hope everyone has enjoyed the summer as we head into fall harvest and hope that everyone is safe as well during harvest.

Ontario County, Joann Rogers:

Ontario County producers started to chop corn; soybeans are starting to turn and the apple harvest has begun.

Suffolk County, Alice V Wise:

Harvest began on Long Island Aug. 31 with fruit destined for sparkling wine. Early varieties may be picked in the near future.
