**Good Week for Field Work:** New York had an average of 5 days suitable for field work.

Scattered rain was reported throughout the state, but this week still saw lots of warm sunny days. Dry weather early on in the week allowed for a rapid harvest. Corn silage, small grains, and dry hay were harvested. Some signs of heat stress are reported but crops are said to be in good condition. Alfalfa and pastures are in good condition and are expected to re-grow after the rain. Field activities for the week included fall tillage, harvesting, repair and maintenance.

## **REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County**

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

#### **Broome County, Maria Heath:**

Corn harvesting in full swing. Corn seems to be dryer than anticipated. Late leaf blight hitting many fields.

#### **Cortland/Tompkins Counties, Jennifer Doty:**

Few scattered showers arrived for the weekend, but ground is still hard & dry. Corn silage harvest is getting well started, while others are still finishing up small grains and dry hay. Pastures have no re-growth.

#### **Essex County, Laura Mcdermott:**

Extremely dry weather came to an end this weekend. Very nice soaking rain dropped amounts between 1" to 2.5" in northern Washington County beginning Saturday afternoon and ending Sunday night.

#### Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties, Nathan R Herendeen:

Hay harvest proceeded rapidly in early part of the week, dry and silage. Had rain Wednesday. Hay and corn Silage continued Thursday, Friday. Then 3.4 inches rain (Gasport area, Niagara County) Saturday September 12, stopped all field activity for a few days!! Corn silage was well underway, corn maturing very rapidly.

#### Oneida County, William Paddock:

The dry spell finally has broken, we received about a quarter of an inch on Wednesday and then back hot until this past weekend. Starting late Friday through Monday morning we have received approximately 1.75 inches. It could be more or less in some areas. We have producers starting corn silage chopping this past week, they have found out that corn is drier than expected so they have begun. Soybeans are really drying down now. Alfalfa and grass meadows looked like the rain has really helped them and we would expect to see a lot of 3rd and 4th cutting to go down as soon as this front moves through today. Pastures will really benefit from the rain as they were looking quite dry and the cool weather will help them bounce back as well. Winter wheat and fall seeding are in or going in as well.

#### **Ontario County, Joann Rogers:**

The beginning of the week in Ontario County was dry and warm for hay harvest and continued corn chopped; the end of the week the county received some much needed rain.

#### Seneca County, Kathy Mastellar:

The week started with hot weather and ended with a weekend of long rain on Saturday and much cooler temperatures.

#### Steuben County, Jamie Earl:

The area received much needed rain towards the end of the week. The area was very dry and the crops were showing signs of stress.

#### St. Lawrence County, Kitty O'Neil:

Corn silage harvest started on Monday, rain on Wednesday and later in the week brought corn chopping to a stop. Region received 0.5 to 2+" of rain. Corn appears to be capable of yielding well. Soybeans are drying down and some have been combined - yields are very good in most fields.

#### Suffolk County, Alice V Wise:

Harvest of fruit for table wine has started in Long Island vineyards. Due to the warm, dry season, harvest is as much as two weeks ahead of the long term average harvest date.
