<u>Good Week for Field Work:</u> New York had an average of 5 days suitable for field work.

This was a busy farm week with mostly mild weather though some frost was reported. The harvest continues with a range of yields, mostly good reports. Wheat planting continues and planted wheat is emerging. Many vineyards have completed harvest, with reports of good quality fruit. Field activities for the week included plowing and planting of fields, fall tillage, harvesting, repair and maintenance.

Broome County, Maria Heath:

Very dry conditions. No regrowth on pastures.

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties, Nathan R Herendeen:

Most of the "excellent" corn grain and soybeans have been harvested. Wheat planting continues after soy. Wheat acreage is up 20 - 25%, in my opinion. Most looks good. Few weeds so far. Weather continues mild and that helps the late planted wheat. Corn and soy yields good, but not outstanding.

Livingston County, Dean R Pendergast:

A busy week on the farm with lots of work getting done.

Ontario County, Joann Rogers:

Ontario County continues to be in full swing of fall harvest of corn and soybeans; the yields are varying with the low ground poor and the high ground yielding well or above average; the majority of the winter wheat has been planted and most has emerged.

Schuyler/ Seneca Counties, Kathy Mastellar:

Frost occurred on October 18th with occasional rain throughout the week. Harvest continues on corn and soybeans

Suffolk County, Alice V Wise:

Many Long Island vineyards finished harvest this past week. The warm dry summer produced quality fruit, though yields were slightly down from 2014. Overall growers are very pleased with 2015.
