<u>Good Week for Field Work:</u> New York had an average of 4.5 days suitable for field work.

Weather was moderate this week in New York, though a few areas reported frost or snowfall. Corn, soybeans and hay are still being harvested. Reports of yields vary. Winter wheat is emerging and looks good. Pasture growth is mostly finished. Field activities for the week included fall tillage, harvesting, repair and maintenance.

Broome County, Maria Heath:

Our first snowfall in the northern part of the county. Corn yields all over the board.

Cortland/Tompkins Counties, Jennifer Doty:

Haylage and corn silage harvest continues, corn grain has begun. Livestock still on pasture is being supplemented with feed.

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties, Nathan R Herendeen:

Corn harvest continued between showers, some soy harvest when foliage was dry enough. Wheat growing well, but some wet areas showing yellows from too much soil moisture.

Livingston County, Dean R Pendergast:

Many producers have completed harvest and are working at fall tillage.

Oneida County, William Paddock:

We still had a few days of wonderful weather. Soybeans appear to be nearly completed and corn is closing in on the end as well. Winter wheat and other summer and fall seeded grains appear to be looking good. Pastures are done except for those that have stockpiled grass. We have not seen anyone still trying to do haylage or baleage in the last week. Have a great winter everyone.

Ontario County, Joann Rogers:

Ontario County experienced another good week for fall harvest and fall tillage.

Schuyler/ Seneca Counties, Kathy Mastellar:

Moderate temperatures this week with only a frost overnight on Nov 8th. Wheat is looking good.

Suffolk County, Alice V Wise:

Harvest is over in Long Island vineyards, growers are cleaning and repairing equipment and other jobs in preparation for winter. Pruning will start in several weeks.
