Good Week for Field Work: New York had an average of 5.5 days suitable for field work. Dry weather continued throughout the state most of this week, with some areas still reporting being in a D3 drought category. Rain ranging from 0.05-1.6 inches were reported in some areas of the state but farmers are still in desperate need of rain. Cooler temperature and several cool nights were reported this week. Fall tillage and corn silage harvest continued this week. Hay harvest has continued as well with report of low yield because of hot and dry weather. Soybeans planted early are dropping leaves and those planted later are progressing well in areas that received some rain. Corn is reported as maturing rapidly. Fruit harvest continued this week and cooler nights aided the fruit color and sizing. Field activities for the week included tillage, fruit harvesting, irrigation, repair and maintenance of equipment.

REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

Broome Co.; Maria Heath:

Corn fields being opened up. Nights cooling off. Pastures providing forage again.

Clinton/ Essex Counties; Anna Wallis:

Apple maturity continues to progress steadily. Ginger gold harvest finished last week and the first McIntosh fruit were harvested at the end of the week. The very first Honeycrisp were spot picked although most fruit needs a few more days for a first pick. A significant amount of fruit sustained hail damage this season and will be marketing for processing. Harvest of this fruit is well underway. Several cool nights this week are expected to improve fruit color. Fruit size is variable but on the small side in most locations.

Cortland/ Tompkins Counties; Jennifer Doty:

Corn silage harvest has begun.

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties; Nathan R. Herendeen:

Continued soil preparation for winter wheat. Planting winter barley, winter triticale. Corn silage harvest continues. Soybeans - early beans shedding leaves, later beans benefit from continued showers, continuing to set pods. Corn maturing rapidly.

Livingston Co.; Dean R. Pendergast:

Corn silage harvest is in full swing. Soybeans are dropping leaves at a rapid pace. No significant rainfall to date.

Ontario Co.; Joann Rogers, County Executive Director FSA:

Ontario County is listed in the D3 level of drought on the US Drought monitor for the 4th consecutive week; crops continued to be stressed with limited rain and warm temperatures; corn for silage continues and reports of low yielding hay. Fall tillage continues.

Schuyler/ Seneca Counties; Kathy Mastellar, CED, Seneca/Schuyler FSA:

Another week of warm, dry weather. We received a brief rain Wednesday and then rain & muggy on Thursday. Corn silage harvest is progressing. Hay is also being harvested.

Steuben County; Jamie Earl:

The area is still in desperate need of rain. Producers have been chopping corn for the last couple of weeks.

Suffolk Co.; Alice V. Wise:

Harvest of fruit for sparkling wine continued this past week on Long Island. Harvest of fruit for still wine is just beginning. Fruit quality is excellent due to the warm, dry season.
