**Excellent Week for Field Work:** New York had an average of 6.0 days suitable for field work. A few areas reported a continuation of dry weather, with some still being in a D3 drought category. Despite dry weather several counties did receive 1.0 – 2.0 inches of rain. The Empire State experienced another week of cooler weather, with lows reaching the mid-40's helping with the coloration in crops. Soybean fields are starting to change and the leaves have been falling, some growers have even started harvesting. Corn silage harvesting is highly active and proceeding at a rapid pace. The dry weather throughout the season has seemed to have a negative impact on the yield of corn and soybeans. Dry hay and haylage harvesting resumed throughout the week, with production seeming to be above average. Several counties started planting winter wheat this week. Vineyards continue processing grapes with several white wines produced and more varieties expected for production in the coming weeks. Picking of McIntosh, Honeycrisp, and Gala apples began towards the end of the week. Field activities for the week included tillage, fruit harvesting, irrigation, repair and maintenance of equipment.

### **REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County**

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

#### **Broome County; Maria Heath:**

Corn chopping is in full swing. Pastures are recovering.

#### Clinton/ Essex Counties; Anna Wallis:

Harvest is in full swing in the Champlain Valley at this time. Several very cool nights over the past week with lows in the mid-40s have led to excellent color development. A large part of hail-damaged crop has been harvested for processing at this time. First picks of McIntosh, Honeycrisp, and Gala began at the end of last week.

#### **Cortland/ Tompkins Counties; Jennifer Doty:**

Soybean fields are starting to change. Corn silage harvest is in full swing. Dry hay and haylage harvest resumed.

#### Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties; Nathan R Herendeen:

Wheat planting got underway Sep 15<sup>th</sup> and is progressing rapidly. Dry hay and Hay crop silage harvest continues. Corn silage harvest is proceeding very rapidly, yields are down. Soybeans are shedding leaves rapidly. One to two inches of rain over the weekend Sept 17-18 will help with fall wheat and triticale planting. Early triticale plantings look excellent.

#### Livingston County; Dean R Pendergast:

D3 drought conditions continue.

#### **Oneida County; Devon Kenny:**

Weather was excellent this past week. There were scattered thunderstorms on Sunday the 18th. Producers throughout the county are reporting harvesting corn for silage. Hay production has been greater than average throughout the county as well.

## Ontario County; Joann Rogers, County Executive Director FSA:

Ontario County continues to be listed in the D3 (extreme drought) on the US drought Monitor. Corn for silage and grain is underway and some have started to harvest soybeans; low yields are being reported as a result of the dry growing year.

## Rensselaer/ Saratoga/ Warren/ Washington Counties; David Holck, USDA-Farm Service Agency:

Corn silage harvest is progressing and most producers are reporting good yields. It has been dry in September and corn is maturing rapidly.

#### **Suffolk County; Alice V Wise:**

Harvest continues in Long Island vineyards with Sauvignon Blanc and Pinot Noir. Harvest of white varieties including Chardonnay will take place in the coming weeks.
