Good Week for Field Work: New York had an average of 5.5 days suitable for field work. Weather varied greatly throughout the empire state this week. Some areas continued to report being in D3 (extreme drought) category while others reported frost sighting and overnight temperatures in the 20's. Additionally, several areas of the state reported receiving 0.01-1.8 inches of rain. Corn silage harvest continued this week and yield varied greatly with some areas reporting average to above average corn silage yields while others reported low yields. Soybean harvest also continued this week and yields varied because of drought in June, July and early August. Winter wheat is reported as emerged and off to a good start. Producers continued harvesting hay in areas that received some rainfall. Hay and pastures are still suffering from the drought in many areas. Honeycrips and McIntosh harvest is nearly complete. Cortland, Macoun and Empire variety harvest is underway in some areas. NY-1, NY-2, Fuji and Red Delicious harvest is expected to follow. Long Island vineyards reported Chardonnay harvest and some blocks of Merlot for rose. Field activities for the week included fruit harvesting, irrigation, repair and maintenance of equipment.

#### October 10, 2016 New York Weekly Weather Summary

### **REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County**

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

#### Clinton/ Essex Counties; Anna Wallis:

Harvest of Honeycrisp and McIntosh is nearly complete, with only final picks and PGR treated fruit remaining. Harvest of Cortland, Macoun, and Empire is underway, complete in some areas. Will be followed by NY-1 and NY-2, Fuji, and Red Delicious. Warm weather last week advanced maturity. Rain contributed between 0.1-0.25" to the region. Colder weather expected this week with frost advisories in the forecast.

#### **Cortland/ Tompkins Counties; Jennifer Doty:**

Soybean harvest has begun, corn silage continues. First hard frost arrived the morning of October 11.

#### Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties; Nathan R. Herendeen:

Corn silage harvest winding down. Yields were low. Corn grain harvest started, variable yields, 100 bushels/acres on early planted short season varieties, 150 on mid-season varieties and later corn looking better. Soybean yields picking up as get to longer season varieties, but still low due to drought June, July and early August. Wheat emergence excellent, off to a good start, few weeds so far.

#### Lewis County; Joe Lawrence, Cornell University PRO-DAIRY:

Many farms are reporting average to above corn silage yields. Groundwater supply continues to be a growing concern as more water sources are causing problems.

#### Livingston County; Dean R. Pendergast:

Continued D3 drought conditions. Harvest season in full swing.

#### **Oneida County; Devon Kenny:**

A lot cooler temperature this week. Producers are still reporting harvesting hay and some have even gotten in a fourth cutting. Soybeans are beginning to be combined and corn is continuing. There was a hard frost in some areas of the county with temps dipping into the 20's overnight. It rained gently on Saturday the 8th on and off for most of the day.

### **Ontario County; Joann Rogers, County Executive Director FSA:**

Ontario County continues to be in the D3 Extreme Drought on the US drought monitor. Corn and soybean harvest continues. Low yields are being reported due to the drought. Hay and pastures are still suffering from the drought.

## Schuyler/ Seneca Counties; Kathy Mastellar, CED, Seneca/Schuyler FSA:

Rain on 10/2, but dry the rest of the week with warm temperatures. Soybeans are being harvested.

#### Suffolk County; Alice V. Wise:

Chardonnay harvest continues in Long Island vineyards. A few blocks of Merlot are being harvested for rose.
