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Excellent Week for Field Work: New York had an average of 6.0 days suitable for field work. Weather has been cool and dry in much of the state throughout the week. Several areas continued to report being in D3 (extreme drought) category. Many regions reported frost accumulation brought on by the cooler weather, with reports of temperatures near freezing in parts of the state. Migrant workers have started to leave as the harvesting season continues to come to a close. Producers have been experiencing lower yields this season throughout several crops. Farmers continue to harvest late hay crops in order to offset lower yields. Corn silage harvesting is going well in several reported areas throughout the state. The majority of white grape varieties are harvested and are being fermented as growers patiently wait for red varieties to reach their peak ripeness. In addition to the fall harvest producers are staying busy with tillage, planting winter wheat, and installing cover crops. Field activities for the week included fruit harvesting, irrigation, repair and maintenance of equipment.

## **REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County**

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

#### **Broome County; Maria Heath:**

Corn harvesting is going well. Wide range of yields depending on what type of soil.

#### Clinton/ Essex Counties; Anna Wallis:

In the Champlain Valley, harvest of all varieties is nearly complete. Migrant workers have started to leave. Harvest is expected to wrap up this week. Weather has been much cooler with lows near freezing several nights last week and at least two hard frosts. Some scattered showers did not provide any meaningful accumulation.

#### **Cortland/ Tompkins Counties; Jennifer Doty:**

Corn grain harvest started, soybean harvest continues, silage harvest continues. Grazing season is winding down.

## Lewis County; Joe Lawrence, Cornell University PRO-DAIRY:

The area has seen a few light frosts but most of the area has not received a killing frost at this point. Reports on corn silage yields remain mostly positive, farms continue to harvest late hay crops to make up for low yields earlier in the season.

#### Livingston County; Dean R. Pendergast:

Continued D3 drought conditions.

## Ontario County; Joann Rogers, County Executive Director FSA:

Ontario County continues to be in D3 Extreme Drought per the US Drought monitor; producers are reporting low yields on most crops as the result of this continued drought. Fall tillage, winter wheat and cover crops installation are activities producers are busy with in addition to the fall harvest.

# Schuyler/ Seneca Counties; Kathy Mastellar, CED, Seneca/Schuyler FSA:

Heavy Frost on October 10th. Warmer than normal weather most of the week and no rain.

#### Suffolk County; Alice V. Wise:

On Long Island, most white grape varieties have been harvested and are fermenting away in the winery. Grape growers are patiently waiting for red varieties such as Merlot to reach their peak ripeness.
