Fair Week for Field Work: New York had an average of 4.0 days suitable for field work. Weather varied greatly throughout the state this week. Rainfall was reported in all regions of the state with several areas in the northern region reporting more than 5 inches of rain. Previously drought stricken areas also reported some rainfall but they continued to be listed in D3 (extreme drought) category. Hard frost was also reported from several areas of the state but no significant crop damage was reported. Heavy rain halted harvesting of crops but the rain was needed to replenish ground water reserves. Producers continued harvesting corn and soybeans. Yields varied depending on soil type and rain received. Not much hay cutting was reported because of the rain and hay cutting is expected to be winding down in the coming weeks. Apple and majority of grapes harvest is winding down as well. Blocks of later ripening varies of grapes such as Cabernet Sauvignon are expected to be harvested in the coming week. Field activities for the week included fruit harvesting, repair and maintenance of equipment.

October 23, 2016 New York Weekly Weather Summary

REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

Broome County; Maria Heath:

Some much needed rain was received. Corn yields vary greatly depending on the soil type and rain received.

Cayuga County; Keith Severson, Cornell Coop Extension Cayuga: Excess rain received on October 20 & 21, creating trouble in the fields and streams.

Chemung/ Cortland/ Tioga/ Tompkins Counties; Janice Degni:

Excellent conditions for harvest have been enjoyed through late October. The killing frost came at the time of the long term average between October 10-15. Soils have been dry so harvest has proceeded without fighting the mud. Just this week October 20 and 21 we received significant rainfall likely to exceed 2 inches. Small grain cover crops planted this fall to date look excellent.

Clinton/ Essex Counties; Anna Wallis:

In the Champlain valley apple harvest is nearly complete. There have been several hard frosts in the region. Approximately 2-4 inches of rainfall was recorded across the region this week with a heavy rain event on Friday and Saturday.

Cortland/ Tompkins Counties; Jennifer Doty:

Much needed rain arrived, but has halted fall harvesting.

Cortland/Oneida County; Devon Kenny:

Weather was all over the board this week. It got into the 80's on Tuesday and it was snowing on Saturday. Heavy rain on Friday and Saturday slowed/halted harvest of dry grain. Towards the end of the week there were several hard frosts as well. Corn and soybeans are being harvested for grain and hay is pretty much finished for the year.

Lewis County; Joe Lawrence, Cornell University PRO-DAIRY:

The area received significant rainfall as much of NY did. Much needed to help replenish ground water reserves. Will impede corn grain and soybean harvest in the coming week

Ontario County; Joann Rogers, County Executive Director FSA:

Ontario County remains in the D3 extreme drought on the US drought monitor; some much needed rain was received this week. Producer continue with corn and soybean harvest.

Schuyler/ Seneca Counties; Kathy Mastellar, CED, Seneca/Schuyler FSA:

Heavy Rains fell Thursday through Saturday! Unfortunately this will halt harvesting of crops, but the rain was needed.

Suffolk County; Alice V Wise:

Harvest is winding down in Long Island vineyards. Blocks of later ripening varieties such as Cabernet Sauvignon are still hanging. These will be harvested in the coming week.
