Good Week for Field Work: New York had an average of 4.5 days suitable for field work. All regions of the state received rainfall this week. Despite some rainfall, Ontario County continues being listed in a D2 "severe drought" category. Fall harvesting continues in many areas, but the rain and cool weather delayed harvesting activities. Winter wheat planting is reported as done in some areas. Early planted wheat is reported as being in excellent condition with very few fall diseases. Soybean and corn yields vary, but both crops have shown excellent test weights. Grape harvest is nearing completion. Vineyards are preparing bird netting for winter storage. Farmers also reported an end of the grazing season. Field activities for the week included planting, fruit harvesting, repair and maintenance of equipment.

REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

Cayuga County; Keith Severson, Cornell Coop Extension Cayuga:

Still a lot of rain, the dry weather at end of last week and start of this week will make a large impact on soybeans and grain corn. Still unharvested yields certainly off because of drought and wet weather postponing harvest.

Cortland/ Tompkins Counties; Jennifer Doty:

Corn and soybean harvest continues, some farmers were able to put up more hay as well. Grazing season is coming to a close.

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties; Nathan R. Herendeen:

Wheat planting done, early planted looks excellent, very few fall diseases. Corn harvest continuing, grain yields low in general, but some excellent. Soy harvest nearly done, many 40 to 50 bushels per acre yields vs. normal of 50 to 60. Very few 70's.

Livingston County; Dean R Pendergast:

Harvest conditions have been favorable, soybean and corn yields are below average but both crops have shown excellent test weights.

Ontario County; Joann Rogers, County Executive Director FSA:

Ontario County remains in a D2 drought on the US drought monitor as of 11/01/2016. Rain and cool weather throughout the week has put a damper on fall harvest.

Schuyler/ Seneca Counties; Kathy Mastellar, CED, Seneca/Schuyler FSA:

Harvest is slow due to another inch of rain last week.

Suffolk County; Alice V. Wise:

The last red grapes were harvested this past week in Long Island vineyards. Vineyard crews are preparing bird netting for winter storage. Over the row bird netting is wound up on spools. Side or panel netting is secured to a wire, usually the wire supporting drip irrigation lines, with cable ties or string.
