**Good Week for Field Work:** New York had an average of 5.5 days suitable for field work. The weather has been consistently cooler throughout the week, with some areas experiencing frost and a little rain. The light rainfall helped Ontario County remain a D2 "severe drought" rating, rather than the even worse D3 categorization just a few weeks earlier. Fall harvest continues as growers continue tillage and planting of small grain and cover crops. Corn and soy harvest are winding down, with yields seeming to be lower this year. Despite the lower yields, quality of commodities are reported to be excellent. Some producers are still harvesting late hay for silage. Now that the harvest for grapes is over, Long Island vineyard crews are removing bird netting and harvesting equipment. Field activities for the week included planting, fruit harvesting, repair and maintenance of equipment.

### November 13, 2016 New York Weekly Weather Summary

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

#### **Broome County; Maria Heath:**

Grain corn is still being harvested. Grazing is ending. The ground is still very dry.

#### Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties; Nathan R. Herendeen:

Grain corn and soy harvest are winding down. Yields are down, quality seems to be good to excellent. Some very late hay crop silage harvesting. Wheat has very few disease symptoms, with excellent growth. Many additional acres of cover crop have been planted this season.

#### Livingston County; Dean R. Pendergast:

Harvest is progressing well, with many producers completed.

#### **Oneida County; Devon Kenny:**

Weather has been consistently cool with frost most nights. Some producers are still harvesting hay. There was a slowdown in grain harvest at the beginning of the week due to high amounts of rain over the weekend.

## Ontario County; Joann Rogers, County Executive Director FSA:

Ontario County continues with fall harvest, tillage and planting small grains and cover crops. The recent rains have improved the drought conditions from D3 Extreme drought to D2 severe drought.

### Schuyler/ Seneca Counties; Kathy Mastellar, CED, Seneca/Schuyler FSA:

Harvest continued but 1 day of rain has made fields slick, so progress is slow.

#### Suffolk County; Alice V. Wise:

Now that harvest is over, Long Island vineyard crews are bringing in bird netting and equipment. A few sites are being prepared for planting next spring.
