<u>Very poor week for field work:</u> New York averaged 0.5 days suitable for field work last week.

New York experienced normal climate conditions with the exception of the southeastern most portions of the state, not including Long Island. Per the U.S. Drought Monitor, many counties just north of the greater New York City area had D0 Abnormally Dry to D1 Moderate Drought classifications. Statewide, the average weekly temperatures were mostly above normal and ranged from one degree below normal to five degrees above normal. Weekly precipitation ranged from 1.15 to 3.66 inches throughout the state. The week was cold and extremely wet making field work impossible. Manure was not even able to be spread. Reports of well water still not recovered for those affected by last summer's drought. Winter crops are starting to green. Fields are extremely wet, but high temperatures and breeze over the next few days should help dry things out.

# Albany/ Schenectady/Schoharie Counties; Sandra Scott, Schoharie/Scenectady/Albany FSA:

The week was cold and extremely wet making field work impossible. Manure was not even able to be spread. The only positive is with all the rain the snow is finally all melted and with the high winds Saturday and nice weather predicted for the beginning of the week hopefully fields will begin to dry out.

### **Broome County; Maria Heath:**

Some flooding occurred. Rye is greening up nicely.

# Cayuga County; Keith Severson, Cornell Coop Extension Cayuga:

Streams were very high and we had snow. Nothing happening.

#### **Cortland/ Tompkins Counties; Jennifer Doty:**

Additional snow and rain added to already soggy soils. River flat fields are either under water or with lots of standing water. Nice weather to end the week has the start of field work on higher gravel grounds. Pastures that were too wet have only begun to start greening up. Reports of well water still not recovered for those affected by last summer's drought.

# Delaware County; Mariane Kiraly, Cornell Cooperative Extension:

Snow melted last week and there is still lots of water running everywhere.

# Erie County; Emily M Dechow, Erie Co. Farm Service Agency:

Erie County received snow on 4/7.

## Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties; Nathan R Herendeen:

Essentially no field work - Maybe some manure spreading. Rain and snow all week. Soil is saturated and groundwater is recharged.

### **Herkimer County; Rachel Hidde:**

Another wet week here in Herkimer County. Heavy rain and snow melt during the past week has produced excessive runoff. Flood warnings were widespread across the County. Standing water in fields was not an uncommon sight.

### Livingston County; Dean R Pendergast:

Heavy rainfall will delay early season work but has helped the water table.

#### **Oneida County: Devon Kenny:**

Weather was very wet last week. Precipitation ranged from heavy rain to several inches of snow in certain portions of the county. There were flood warnings and there is still a lot of standing water in low lying areas.

### Onondaga County; Seara Lelakowski:

Winter crops are starting to green. Fields are extremely wet, but high temperatures and breeze over the next few days should help dry things out. Streams/lakes/ponds/rivers all over the county are full or flooded. Livestock have been placed back on pasture.

# Ontario County; Joann Rogers, County Executive Director FSA:

Ontario County had mild weather at the beginning of the week and rain/snow at the end of the week. Producers are reporting concerns over manure storage and being able to spread with the recent wet conditions.

# Rensselaer/ Saratoga/ Warren/ Washington Counties; David Holck, USDA-Farm Service Agency:

Our counties got over 1.5 inches of rain between Tuesday and Friday. Cropland remains saturated. Farmers are spreading manure on well drained fields.

# Schuyler/ Seneca Counties; Kathy Mastellar, CED, Seneca/Schuyler FSA:

Another rainy, snowy week prevented any field work

### Suffolk County; Alice V Wise:

Long Island vineyard crews continue to tie canes to the trellis. Buds are starting to swell.

### **Wyoming County; Ashley Simmons:**

Extremely wet, nearly 4 inches of rain since the first of the month. Snow one day this week and then spring-like conditions expected for next week.

### Yates County; Amy Parmelee, Farm Service Agency

The rains continued for the better part of this week. Fields have standing water.
