New York Weekly Crop Weather – September 17th, 2017:

New York had an excellent week for field activities with an average of 6.0 days suitable for field work. Temperatures were reported with a high of 86° (F), a low of 34° (F) and a state average temperature of 63° (F). Oats harvested for grain and second cuttings of hay are almost finished for the state, while corn for silage harvest has just begun. Field activities involved preparing for wheat planting, manure spreading, fall tillage, and spraying.

REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

Broome County; Maria Heath:

Producers concerned frost will hit before corn is mature for silage. Pods are set for soybeans, but beans are not developing well. Producers trying to get another cutting of alfalfa in while waiting for corn.

Cayuga County; Colleen Cargile, Cayuga County FSA:

Producers have started harvesting corn silage in Cayuga County for corn that was planted early. We have been told by producers that corn silage harvest will be very spread out, as it will be correlated when the corn was planted, which was also very spread out. Parts of the southern end of Cayuga County received up to 4 inches of rain on 9/14/2017.

Clinton/Essex Counties; Michael Robert Basedow:

Steady rain this summer has given good fruit size. Cool nights in early September led to good color development. Warm dry weather this week is allowing fruit to mature a few days ahead of their usual harvest time.

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties; Nathan R Herendeen:

Wheat planting started Sept 15 or 16 - a little early, but farmers are worried about more wet weather possibility.

Hay and hay crop silage harvest continues. Corn silage harvest will move quickly this week.

Livingston County; Dean R Pendergast:

A week of dry warmer weather has helped crops advance.

Oneida County; Devon Kenny:

Temps have been higher than average during the day and cool at night. Almost no rain has led to a lot of field work and hay getting done. Reports of continued harvest of sweet corn and beans as well as some wheat and fall seedings. With continued warmer temps producers are more optimistic that crops will be able to have enough growing degree days to make it to maturity after the cool wet summer.

Ontario County; Joann Rogers, County Executive Director FSA:

Ontario County almost had its first week of no rain and warm temperatures, but there were some limited pop up sprinkles in some areas. Corn for silage harvest has started, fruit tree harvest continues and some fall prep work has begun with manure spreading and tillage.

Oswego County; Ellen deMey:

The warm, dry weather has enabled a lot of hay to be chopped and baled in the past week. Corn silage harvest has begun with the hope that the fields will remain dry enough through harvest. Beans that were planted early have started to dry down and yields are anticipated to be better than originally anticipated.

Schuyler/ Seneca Counties; Kathy Mastellar, CED, Seneca/Schuyler FSA:

Reports are that corn & soybean harvest are still a few weeks away. Forage crops were being harvested due to some rain-free days this week. Land is being prepared for wheat planting.
