**Good week for field work:** New York averaged 5.5 days suitable for field work last week.

Slightly cooler, dry conditions with spots of rain and frost characterized this past week's crop weather conditions for New York. The average weekly temperatures ranged from 0 to 11 degrees above normal. Weekly precipitation ranged from 0.00 to 1.67 inches. Producers made some progress on harvesting soybeans as well as corn silage. Field conditions were still good and yields had positive outlook overall. Apple harvested also moved forward.

### October 8, 2017 New York Weekly Weather Summary

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

#### **Broome County; Maria Heath:**

Frost has hit many areas and corn has dried down. Harvesting is in full gear. Ears not totally filled out.

#### Clinton/ Essex Counties; Michael Basedow:

Dry weather throughout most of the week allowed apple harvest to continue.

#### Fulton/ Hamilton/ Montgomery Counties; Andrew Michael:

Here, in the Tri County area of Eastern Central New York including: Montgomery, Fulton and Hamilton Counties, we continue to have some of the best weather of the growing season and we are hoping to have a little more. We did have a light scattered frost this past week.

#### Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties; Nathan R Herendeen:

Corn silage harvest was progressing rapidly. We had some storm interruptions, but not heavy rains. Field conditions are still good and yields are very good. Soy harvest continues slowly as beans mature. Yields are good at this point. Wheat planting continues as soy is harvested and field conditions allow.

#### Livingston County; Dean R Pendergast:

Corn silage harvest continues and some soybean harvest has begun.

#### **Oneida County; Devon Kenny:**

Weather has been seasonal with spotty reports of overnight frost. Corn is being harvested for silage and most soybeans are dropping leaves. Conditions are normal for this time of year. Wheat is still being reported as going in but most is already planted. Rainfall has been good after that long dry spell we had in September.

## Ontario County; Joann Rogers, County Executive Director FSA:

Parts of Ontario County experienced a frost at the beginning of the week. Fall tillage and planting of small grains continued, as did the harvest.

# Schuyler/ Seneca Counties; Kathy Mastellar, CED, Seneca/Schuyler FSA:

A few days of light rain occurred this past week with cooler temperatures, but a couple of really nice days were above 70. Soybeans are starting to be harvested. Grain corn will start being harvested soon.
