Excellent week for field work: New York averaged 6.5 days suitable for field work.

Although some frost was reported in areas and rain has decreased, New York experienced warm weather this past week.

Temperatures ranged from 2 degrees below to 9 degrees above normal. Weekly precipitation ranged from 0.00 to .58 inches. Producers began to wrap up corn silage harvest and hay cutting while soybean harvest remained in full swing with corn lagging. Many operators have completed wheat planting. Apples also started to wrap up the season. Long Island vineyard operators started picking Merlot and began to wrap up Chardonnay. Quality and yields continued to be reported positively.

REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

Broome County; Maria Heath:

Weather has been very conducive to getting corn chopped and cover crops completed.

Cayuga County; Colleen Cargile, Cayuga County FSA:

Cayuga County had a week of dry, sunny, and warm weather. Many producers are finishing up harvesting corn silage and the last cutting of haylage. Soybeans are being harvested. And most all fall grains have been planted. Cooler and rainy weather is in the forecast.

Clinton/ Essex Counties; Michael Basedow:

Dry weather has allowed apple harvest to continue. Frost was observed Tuesday morning. Apple harvest is nearing completion in Clinton County.

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties; Nathan R Herendeen:

Some wheat planting after soy harvest. All wheat that was timely planted looks good to excellent. Corn silage harvest winding down. Yields and quality have been excellent. Soy harvest has made great progress, yields have been good to excellent - 45 - 70 bu/acre range. Corn grain harvest started with excellent yield & quality reports.

Livingston County; Dean R Pendergast:

A great week of weather has helped all things farming.

Oneida County; Devon Kenny:

Weather has been unseasonably warm with cool nights. There was one night with a heavy frost. Soybeans are being combined throughout the county ahead of corn, as corn is taking longer to dry down in the field. Wheat is pretty much done being planted. Producers are very busy trying to get soybeans off as well as combine and chop corn so the office has been slow. There has even been a few areas where producers have taken a late hay harvest.

Ontario County; Joann Rogers, County Executive Director FSA:

Ontario County experienced some high winds and rain at the beginning of the week and some parts of the county had another frost. Corn-silage, soybean, grape, apple and vegetable harvest continued. Fall tillage, cover crops and fall small grains continued.

Oswego County; Ellen deMey:

Unseasonable warm temperatures have helped the ground dry and harvest progress. Soybean harvest is in full swing and corn silage chopping is winding down. Few reports of corn grain harvest as a result of the wet spring and late planting.

Schuyler/ Seneca Counties; Kathy Mastellar, CED, Seneca/Schuyler FSA:

Frost on October 16th but warm, sunny weather all week! Harvest has started on soybeans but still not a lot ready. Corn silage is almost done. Minimal grain corn has been harvested.

Suffolk County; Alice V Wise:

Harvest continued in Long Island vineyards. The last blocks of Chardonnay were picked. The first blocks of reds such as Merlot were also picked. Growers are pleased with fruit quality and yields.
