<u>Poor week for field work:</u> New York averaged 2.5 days suitable for field work compared to 5 days suitable last week.

Temperatures ranged from 3 degrees below to 9 degrees above normal. Weekly precipitation ranged from 0.06 to 5.56 inches. Rain conditions increased over prior week and further delayed harvesting in general this past week for many crops throughout the state. Corn and soybeans were of particular concern as this was the second week of rain delays. That said, the corn that has been harvested so far has been described as positive in many areas and wheat growth has been excellent except where conditions were overly wet. Vineyards on Long Island completed their last of Cabernet Sauvignon picking, removed bird netting, and began to prepare for winter.

REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

Cayuga County; Colleen Cargile, Cayuga County FSA:

It has rained nearly every day in Cayuga County in the last week. Some parts of the County have received over 6 inches of rain in the last week. This could make completing harvest for grain corn and soybeans extremely difficult.

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties; Nathan R Herendeen:

Had a few hours each day early in the week for soy and corn harvest. Still a little corn silage being harvested, but nearly 100 % done. Wheat growth excellent except in wet areas. Rains every night or morning, now very wet - essentially all soils saturated and more rain coming. Corn harvest delayed. No hard freeze yet in Niagara-Orleans area.

Lewis County; Joe Lawrence:

Significant rains continued this past week. Almost all crops are out of the field except for grain corn.

Livingston County; Dean R Pendergast:

Heavy rains have delayed harvest for many producers.

Oneida County; Devon Kenny:

Producers are getting soybeans and corn grain off. Reporting soybeans are coming off very dry and light. Corn harvest is good. Winter wheat is sprouting and greening up. Producers are hoping it doesn't grow too much as that will be a problem when it gets covered in snow. Nights have been cold with some hard frosts and there has been heavy rains the past few days that have all but halted field work due to mud.

Ontario County; Joann Rogers, County Executive Director FSA:

Weather was very rainy. Corn harvest continues however the rain slowed harvest.

Oswego County; Ellen deMey:

Oswego County has received in excess of 8 inches of rain in the past week creating more setbacks to an already delayed harvest. Producers have reported significantly reduced soybean yields as a result of late planting and cool, wet growing conditions. Corn silage harvest is not yet complete and at a standstill. Few acres have been harvested for grain at this time.

Schuyler/ Seneca Counties; Kathy Mastellar, CED, Seneca/Schuyler FSA:

A week of rain hindered harvesting crops.

Suffolk County; Alice V Wise:

The last few blocks of Cabernet Sauvignon were picked this week on Long Island. Growers are removing bird netting from the vineyard and preparing it for winter storage.
