Very poor week for field work: New York averaged 1 day suitable for field work.

Temperatures ranged from 4 degrees to 16 degrees below normal. Weekly precipitation ranged from 0.31 to 3.01 inches. New York continued to experience low temperatures and wet soils in many parts of the state with little to no field work. Some parts also reported snowfall. Fruit trees were delayed with reports of no flowering or bud development in some areas. Grapes were in a bud swell stage.

REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

Broome County; Maria Heath:

The weekend finally looked like spring. Still had snow on Friday. Spreading of manure has started as pits are getting very full.

Cayuga County; Keith Severson, Cornell Coop Extension Cayuga:

Still snowing. Soil temp below 40F.

Cayuga County; Colleen Cargile, Cayuga County FSA:

Cold weather hung around for most of last week, with much of Cayuga County even seeing snow. For the coming week, the weather looks to be much warmer and more suitable for spring. The ground is still very saturated, which does not make any tillage or planting possible at this time.

Columbia/ Greene Counties; Matthew Forrest:

Cold, rainy/snowy weather has continued to delay fieldwork & Planting. Some planting; which was occurring earlier in the month, has been stopped until conditions improve, like early sweet corn. No field corn has been planted which is unusual. Usually, some has been planted by the middle of April. Fruit trees are very delayed. No flowering or even significant bud development due to cold conditions. This may or may not be a problem.

Erie County; Emily Miller, CCE - Erie Co:

Temperatures in Erie County remain far below average and 3 - 6 inches of snow fell across the county this week.

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties; Nathan R Herendeen:

Some application of Nitrogen on wheat continues. Some tillage for sweet corn and vegetables on earliest soils. Manure was applied on a few of the best drained fields. Nitrogen and Potassium was also applied on the best drained grass & alfalfa fields.

Lewis County; Joe Lawrence:

Saturday and Sunday were good drying days but many fields are still quite wet. Very little field work has been performed. Farms will be anxious to spread manure and begin field operations but rain was forecasted for Wednesday and may negate any gains in field conditions made over the last few days.

Livingston County; Dean R Pendergast:

The current weather pattern continues to delay spring field work.

Oneida County; Devon Kenny:

Weather has continued to be much colder than normal with several snow storms as well. Wind, sub-freezing temps as well as rain and snow have made it impossible to begin spring field work.

Ontario County; Joann Rogers, County Executive Director FSA:

Ontario County experienced another week of cooler than normal temperatures with ice, rain and snow. Spring work has been delayed with very wet soils. Wheat and hay fields could use some warmer temperatures and sunshine.

Schuyler/ Seneca Counties; Kathy Mastellar, CED, Seneca/Schuyler FSA:

Between snow & rain this week, no field work was done. Temperatures remained below 40 degrees with a coating of snow Friday morning with 27 degrees.

Suffolk County; Alice V Wise:

Due to the cool spring, grape buds are still in the bud swell stage.

Yates County; Amy Parmelee, Farm Service Agency

Another very cold and wet week. We actually have a dusting of snow and some ice this morning. Yates County is very behind with the early spring crops getting planted such as oats.
