Poor week for field work: New York averaged 2.0 days suitable for field work.

Cold temperatures set in ranging from 4 degrees below normal to 5 degrees above normal. Weekly precipitation ranged from .36 to 3.52 inches. Continued rain and wet conditions persisted, preventing many operations from making much progress on corn and soybean harvest as well as winter wheat planting. Soybean harvesting was particularly hard hit as the ground was too wet for combines. For producers in the few areas not impacted by wet conditions, yields have been positive. Long Island vineyards have completed their harvest and began cleaning up this past week.

REPORTERS COMMENTS, By County

Reporters are from Extension Service (Ext), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), Farm Service Agency (FSA), Conservation District (CD), farmers, commodity specialists, or other knowledgeable individuals.

Cortland/Tompkins Counties; Jennifer Doty:

More rain occurred this past week and the few nice days were hindered by mud. Progress is slowly moving forward.

Delaware County; Mariane Kiraly, Cornell Cooperative Extension:

More rain made fields wet and little took place last week.

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties; Nathan R Herendeen:

Heavy rains during the week of Oct 29th slowed all field work. Soybean and corn harvest needs 3 drying days to resume harvest. Winter wheat planting done, some acres intended for after soybean will not be planted.

Livingston County; Dean R Pendergast:

Rain continues to limit harvest throughout the county. Very few soybeans were harvested; if any, and corn harvest is moving slowly. Winter wheat acreage will be down for 2019.

Monroe/ Wayne Counties; Bruce Wadhams, Farm Service Agency:

It has been very wet in Wayne County. There are a lot of soybeans not harvested yet due to wet conditions and constant rain.

Oneida County; Devon Kenny:

Rain continues to be an issue with harvest. There are reports of both soybeans and corn sprouting in the fields. Conditions have been too wet to run the combine especially for soybeans. There has been no snow to speak of and also no real hard freeze as of yet so conditions are very muddy. Producers who have managed to combine corn and soy for grain have said yields are higher than normal. There have been prevented planting reports for wheat as well due to the excess precipitation.

Schuyler/ Seneca Counties; Kathy Mastellar, CED, Seneca/Schuyler FSA:

Another week of rain is hindering harvest and preventing wheat from being planted due to no open fields. Reports of sprouted soybeans.

Suffolk County; Alice V Wise:

Long Island vineyards are finished with harvest. Crews are cleaning up harvest equipment and bringing in bird netting.
