New York Weekly Crop Weather: According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in New York, there were 4.5 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, September 1st, 2019. Topsoil moisture supplies were 2 percent very short, 9 percent short, 64 percent adequate, and 25 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 2 percent very short, 10 percent short, 66 percent adequate, and 22 percent surplus. Pasture conditions ranged from 1 percent very poor, 9 percent poor, 32 percent fair, 48 percent good, and 10 percent excellent.

Cayuga County; Colleen Cargile:

Cool, wet, fall-like weather was present for much of the week. The corn and soybeans are still looking fairly decent, but hopefully the fall-like weather trend doesn't continue and the temperatures stay above freezing. We certainly don't need an early frost, especially since the crops were planted late and are behind and still maturing. And after all the rain this week, there is now concern about getting fall crops in the ground. It is almost time to start planting wheat, but the ground needs to dry out quite a bit before anyone can get in the fields. Hopefully there are some warmer and drier days in store.

Genesee/ Niagara/ Orleans Counties; Nathan R Herendeen:

Forage seeding planting is done. Hay crop and hay crop silage harvest continues - all stages of growth. Corn and soybeans that were late planted continue to make excellent growth - plenty of moisture and heat. Late frost needed. Corn silage harvest will be stretched out. Wheat planting will be ready to proceed rapidly on open acreage.

Ontario County; Joann Rogers, County Executive Director FSA:

Ontario County continues with harvest of hay, some fruit crops and vegetables. Fall tillage continues on some fields.

Suffolk County; Alice V Wise:

Ripening has accelerated in Long Island vineyards thanks to timely rainfall and warm weather.
