


N.C. FARMERS TO PLANT MORE CORN, PEANUTS, AND WHEAT, LESS COTTON, AND SOYBEANS


- Corn plantings are expected to total 990,000 acres in 2023, up 19% from 2022.
- **Cotton** growers intend to plant 380,000 acres in 2023, down 19% from last year.
- Flue-cured tobacco growers expect to harvest 111,000 acres in 2023, down 4% from 2022.
- Burley tobacco growers expect to harvest 110 acres in 2023, down from 160 acres last year.
- **Soybean** plantings, at 1.65 million acres, down 3% from 2022.
- **Peanut** growers intend to plant 130,000 acres in 2023, up 11% from the planted acreage in 2022.
- Hay producers expect to cut 637,000 acres in 2023, down 3% from the 2022 estimate.
- Winter wheat plantings totaled 500,000 acres, up 4% from last year.









NC Upland Cotton - (Thousand Acres)
